INQUIRIES SOLICITED

The General Assembly of the
Presbyterian Church, at their meeting
in Owen Sound, refused to accept the
amendments proposed in the House
of Commons, and again voted for
church union by a majority of over 4
to 1. The Assembly has again made
it clear that they believe it is the
right of the church to adjudicate in
all matters of doctrine, worship,
government and discipline of the
Church.

The addresses which are being
given in Toronto and various other
parts of Canada by Mr. Whelan, of
London, England, bearing on the
work of The League of Nations,
should have a salutary effect on
thoughtful people. In his address in
the Uptown Theatre Sunday evening,
he showed plainly the need of such a
League, if the will of the sword is to
be displaced by more civilized
methods of settling disputes among
nations. The speaker gave instances
showing that the settlement of
threatened war between countries
had been brought about by the
League of Nations

SIR ADAM BECK'S NEW RATES

The Daily Star in a recent issue
asked the following questions:
"Can Sir Adam Beck force his
new Hydro rates on the small homes
of Toronto despite all opposition, and
on the other Hydro municipalities of
the province despite anything their
commissions may do?"
"Can the whole city council of To-
be disqualified from office for five
years for unanimously instructing
Mayor Hiltz to oppose these rates, if
his opposition results in a rate being
charged, which Sir Adam does not
approve."

"Can the Hydro commissioners
themselves be removed from office
and disqualified for five years if they
keep charging the old rates instead
of putting the new ones into force?"
The Star answers its own ques-
tions by saying "It seems so." The
reason given is that Sir Adam had
a bill put through the Legislature,
which puts the City Council and the
local commissioners in the hollow of
his hand.

If some effort is not made to satisfy
the laboring class that they are
fairly treated "Public Ownership"
will cease to be popular.

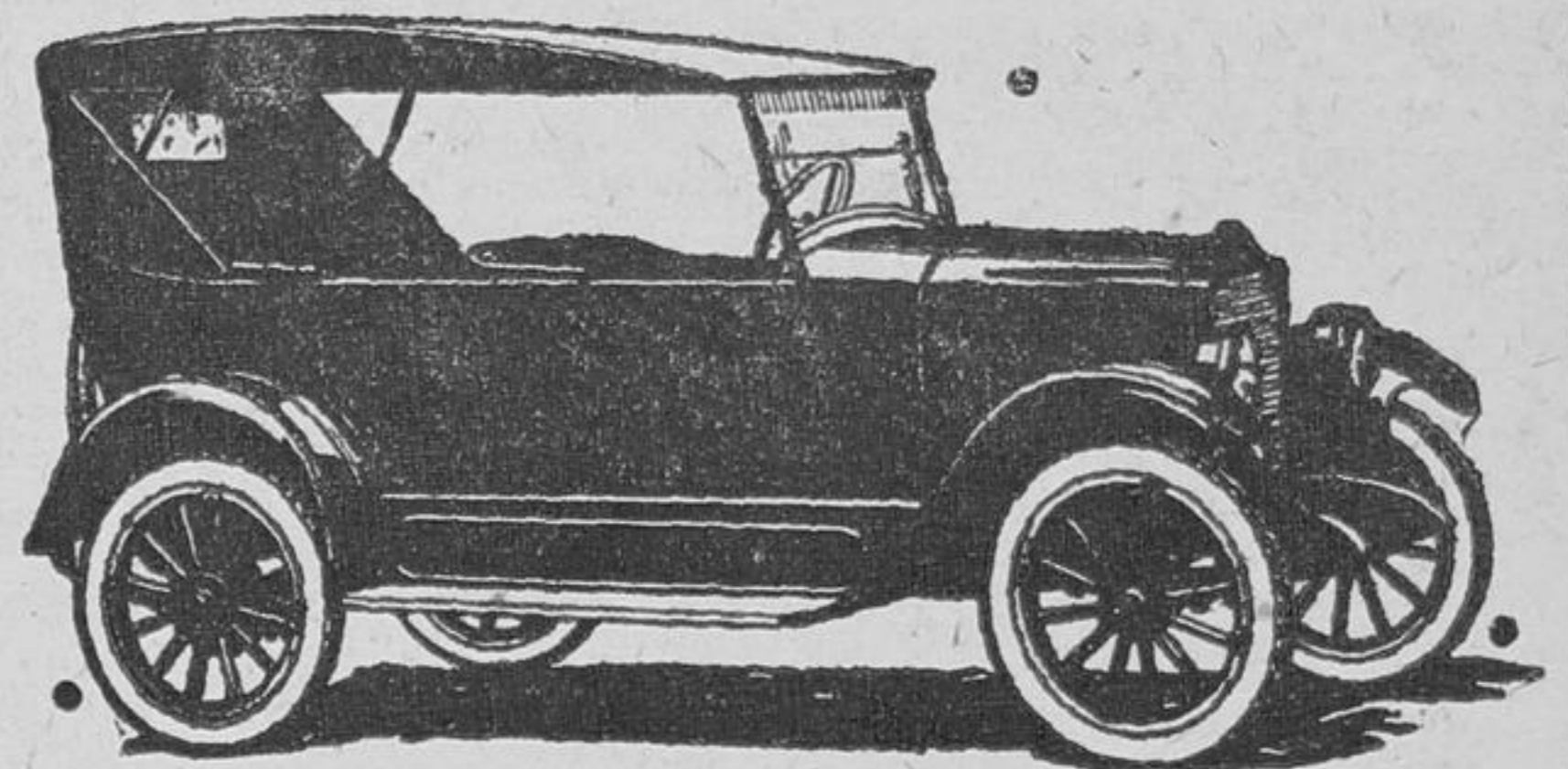

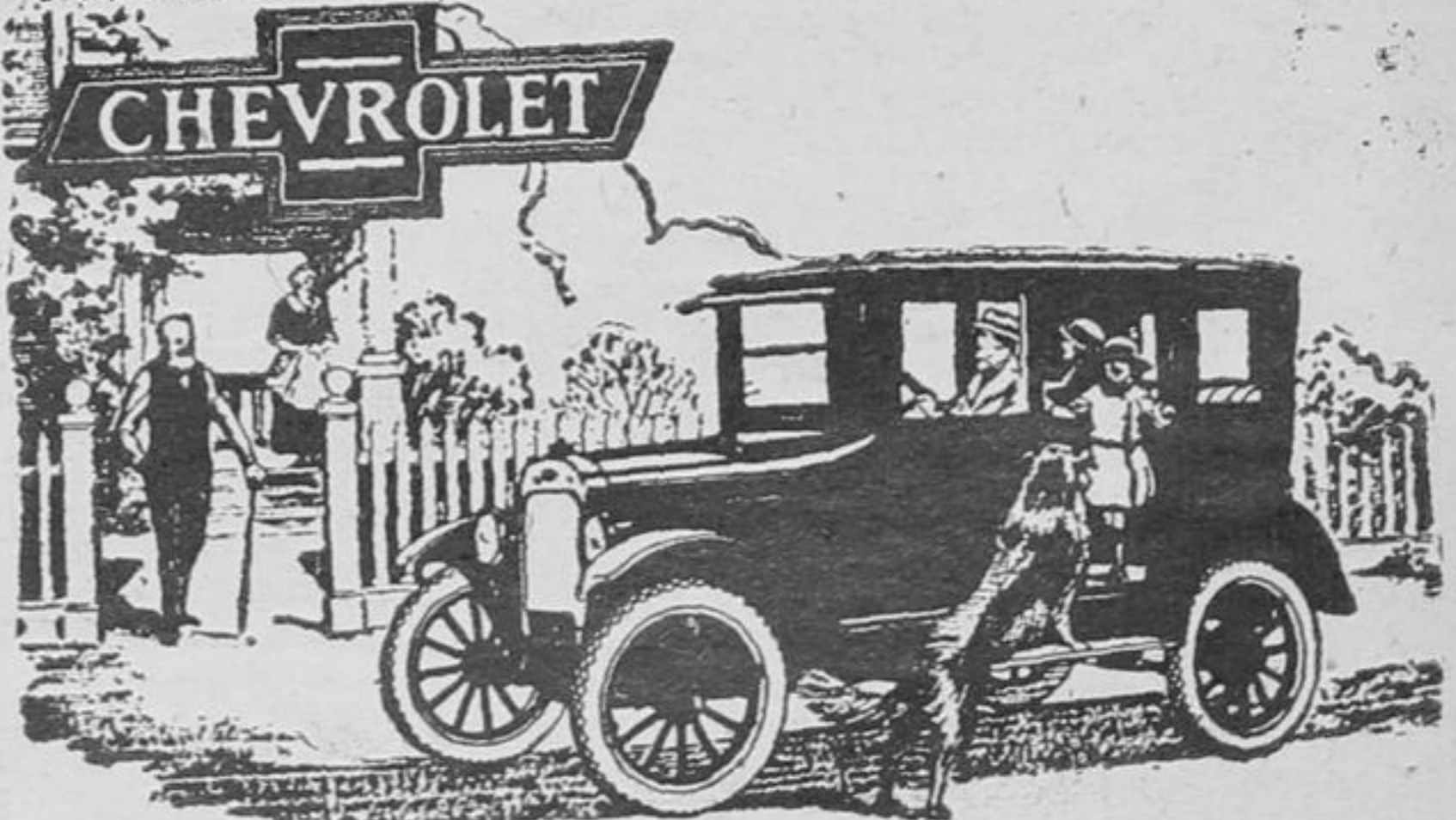
