## Sporting Notes

A team of Richmond Hill ball girls played together for the first time this year at Thornhill tournament on Tuesday. They had no intention of playing any games until they had had a few practices together, but on the solicitation of Secretary Dean, of the Thornhill Executive, received by yours truly on Monday, the evening was spent in rounding up the following players for the occasion: Misses Francis Batty, Janet French, Daisy Hart, Isobel Cowie, Lillian Burns, Margaret Ireland, Marjory Tindall, Gl. dys Grant, Violet Sherpard, and Olive Paris.
