At the recent meeting of York County Council a resolution was passed authorizing that a by-law be prepared to guarantee debentures for \$95,000 for the erection and equipment of a High School at Richmond Hill. Over 60 per cent of the pupils attending are county pupils.

The second prize, 4 casseros, was won by Riverdale rink; and third prize, 4 Bowl bags went to the Withrow club. Everybody seemed pleased with the day's sport.

Laid to Rest

The funeral of the late Mrs. S. J. Shepherd took place from the residence last Friday. The remains were taken into St. Mary's Church, where the service was conducted by the rector, Rev. F. S. Battersby. The casket was covered with floral tributes from relatives and friends, including a spray from the Young Ladies baseball club, the daughter, Miss Violet, being a member. The deepest sympathy is felt for the husband and daughters in their sad and sudden bereavement.

Another Field Day

A meeting of the ratepayers was held in the Council Chamber, Tuesday evening, when it was decided to have a Field Day on Monday, the 4th of August—Toronto and Richmond Hill's Civic Holiday. Clarke House Burnt

Fire broke out Thursday evening in the brick residence belonging to Mr. Robert Clarke, near Elgin Mills, and immediately opposite the Orange Orphanage. The Richmond Hill town bell was rung, the fire brigade was called out, and in a few minutes Yonge street was lined with motor cars and other vehicles. The fire was soon under control, and thinking that the danger was over the hundreds of people went to their homes, but the fire again broke out about 1 a.m., completely destroying the house. The house had been vacated only a few days before by Rev. Mr. Trivett. The fire was caused by an electric iron which Mrs. Clarke had been using during the afternoon, and neglected to turn off the current before returning to the city. The building and contents were insured.

A Memorable Occasion

Capt. James Hill, of Orillia celebrated with his sons, his nintieth birthday, Sunday, July 6, 1924. Capt. Hill was born in County Antrim, Ireland, and went to sea at the early age of fourteen. During his twenty five years at sea, he visited practically all parts of the world, sailing his ships over the seven seas. Coming to Canada in 1872, he settled in Medonte township where he spent forty years on his farm. Thrice he mourned the loss of a very dear one, his only daughter dying in 1884, his youngest son, Thomas, of Craighurst in 1918 and his dearly beloved wife in 1915 at the age of 87. At the celebration were gathered five sons with their wives, Capt. Samuel, of Orillia; James of Elmvalle; David, of Richmond Hill; Allan, of Alliston, and John, of Peterboro. His other son William, of Buffalo, was unavoidably absent, but four generations of grandchildren were present to do honor to their grandfather. From far and wide the venerable old Captain received very hearty birthday congratulations and well wishes for continued good health.
