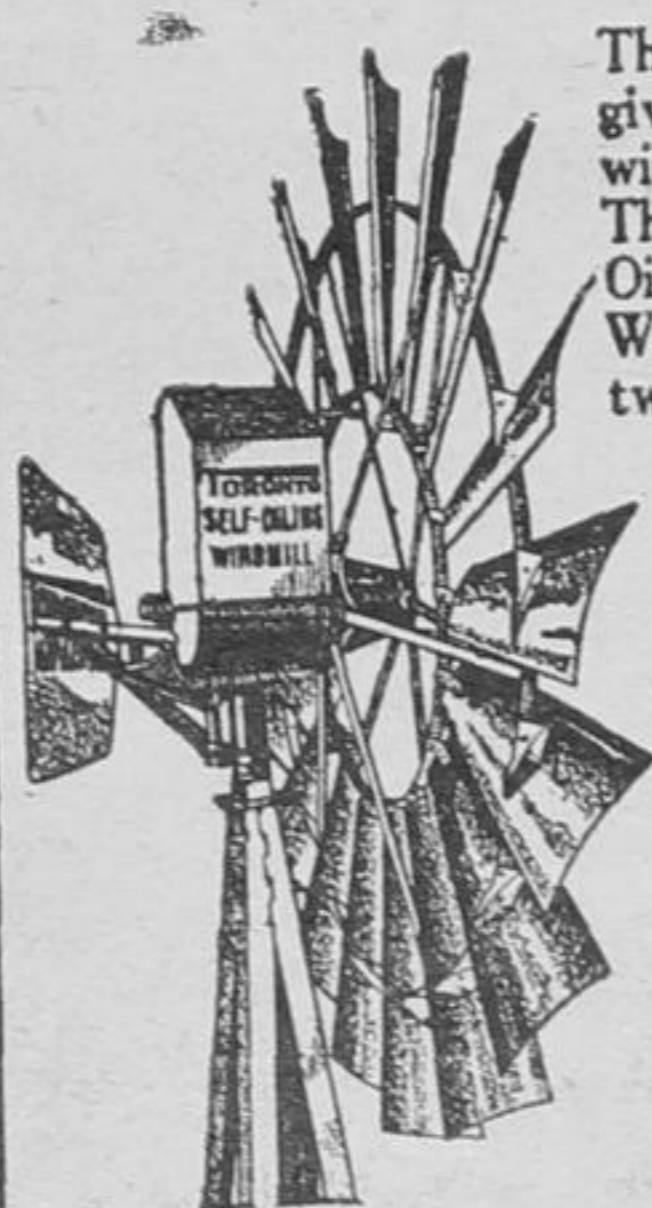

TORONTO SELF-OILING WINDMILLS

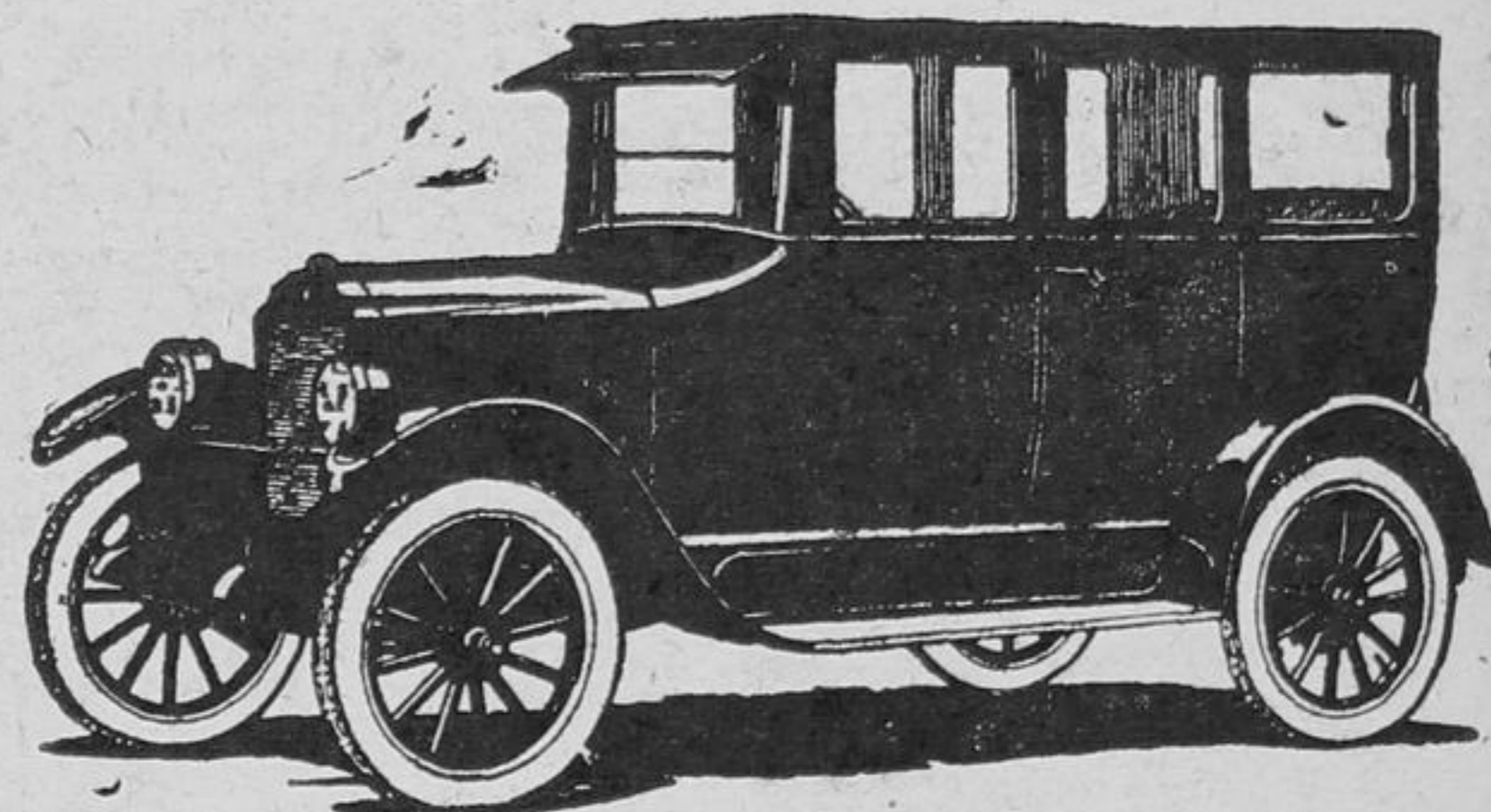

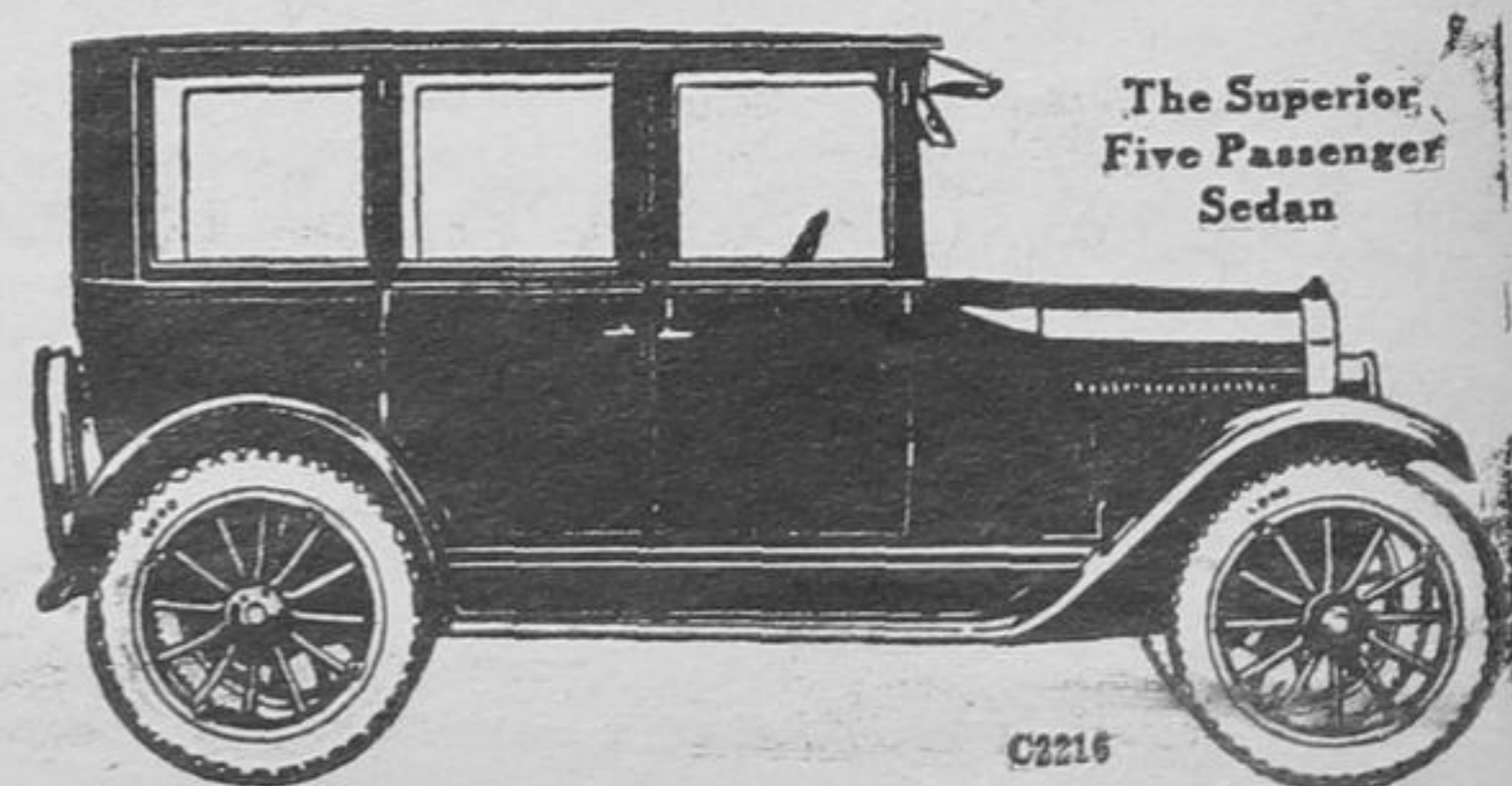
