

EASY TRICKS

The Cut Foretold



This stunt is invariably successful if it is performed in a matter of fact, straightforward manner. Observe, while shuffling the cards which card is on the bottom of the pack. This can easily be done, and will excite no suspicion as the trick does not immediately follow. Borrow a business card, write the name of the card you observed on it and seal it in the envelope. Before doing this, place the pack of cards, face down, on the table.

Ask the spectator to cut the cards into two parts in the usual manner. Place the envelope on the packet which was the upper pack-or ask a spectator to do this and place the other packet on the envelope.

The rest of the trick consists of showing, in as impressive a manner as possible, the "fact" that before the cards were cut that you wrote the name of the card at which the spectator cut.

Artificial Silk Stockings.

Silkworms live on a particular sort of Mulberry leaves, from which they extract a substance known as cellulose, digest it, and afterwards spin it cut into threads of silk.

Science, however, has discovered that the cellulose can be digested by chemical means without the aid of the worm. Furthermore, there are substances other than mulberry leaves which contain this cellulose.

Pinewood, for instance, contains it, the extract being treated in one of several methods all resulting in much the same way, the artificially "digested" cellulose being converted into a treacle-like liquid capable of being drawn out into threads.

These threads are then hardened and set, afterwards being spun into the "silg" which either alone or in combination with other material, makes artificial silk stockings.
