### Reduced Drinking 65 P. C.

WHAT PROHIBITION DOES  
ARRAY OF FACTS FROM GOVERNMENT  
STATISTICS GIVEN BY REV. W. L.  
LAWRENCE.

"Here are some of the facts taken  
from Government statistics that can-  
not be gained in regard to British  
Columbia, a government sale Pro-  
vince," said Rev. W. L. Lawrence,  
speaking Sunday night to his congre-  
gation in Broadway Methodist Taber-  
nacle. Mr. Lawrence then proceeded  
to read from the following:

Sales of liquor in British Columbia  
during last six months ending De-  
cember, 1920, under prohibition,  
were.....\$99,376  
Sales during six months ending  
September, 1923, under Govern-  
ment sale, were.....\$5,717,624.  
Yearly average of prisoners sent  
to Oakalla Jail under prohibition  
.....511  
Yearly average under Government  
sale.....1,565  
Yearly average of prisoners in pen-  
itentiary under prohibition.....61  
Yearly average under Government  
sale.....113

While Mr. Lawrence freely admit-  
ted that prohibition had not stopped  
bootlegging—of which so much is  
seen—nor had it stopped liquor drink-  
ing, which would go on as long as the  
stuff was manufactured, yet he did not  
see how any opponent of prohibition  
could twist or gainsay the incontrovert-  
ible statistics.

"Prohibition does prohibit," he said  
earnestly. — Newmarket Express Her-  
ald.

### King Township Council

At the last meeting of King Council,
