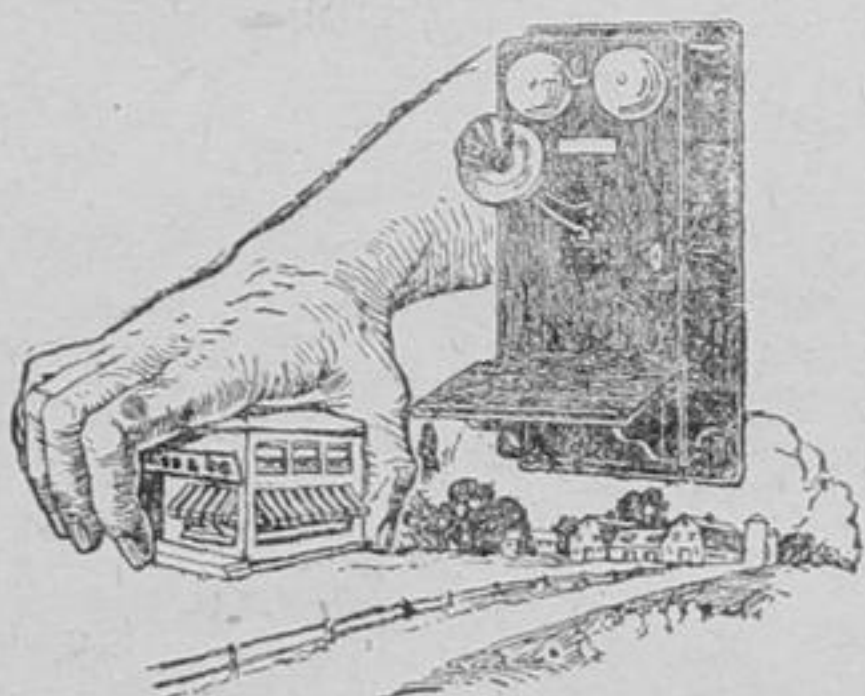
## WHAT "CONTROL" IS DOING

Voters in Ontario who are inclin-  
ed to think that government control  
would lessen drinking in this pro-  
vince should read the resolution passed  
by the convention of British Colum-  
bia municipalities, held at Prince  
Rupert in August:

"That this convention places itself  
on record as strongly protesting  
against the present disgraceful situa-  
tion throughout the province in re-  
gard to the formation of clubs and  
the sale of liquor therein; that the  
present situation is worse than in the  
days of the open bar and is not only  
destructive to the morals of the  
people, but is resulting in bringing  
about general contempt for law and  
order; that the government be urged  
at the earliest possible moment to con-  
sider this situation and enact laws  
to alter this deplorable state of  
affairs"

Yet we are told that government  
control is the policy that Ontario  
should adopt.
