It is said that J. A. Pinard, M.P.P. for East Ottawa, will move for local option when the Legislature meets. J. A. McCausland may second the motion and Col. J. A. Currie may speak, thus forming a party of "J.A.'s."—Globe.

At a meeting of the Moderation League held in Massey-Hall a few nights before the 23rd, the favorite song seemed to be "How Dry I Am." The thirsty songsters will, apparently, have to warble the same song for some time to come.

It is surprising the number of prominent men in Toronto who declined to be interviewed previous to the plebiscite vote on the 23rd of October. Poor men who might be excused for keeping their opinions to themselves, but to think of clergymen, barristers and other professional men saying they declined to tell how they proposed voting, seems incomprehensible. To say the least, these men were not at all proud of the stand they were taking.

Although it was stated and repeated from time to time that bootleggers in Toronto and other places would vote for a continuance of the O. T. A. few thoughtful people could make themselves believe anything so ridiculous. In the recognized bootlegging districts in Toronto, the vote as published in the sub-divisions shows conclusively that the bootleggers as a body supported government control. The wonder is that an attempt was made to make people believe such an absurd argument.

Notwithstanding statements by J. A. McCausland, M.P.P., and other Government Control men, Premier Ferguson lost no time in letting it be known that as Local Option was not referred to on the ballot paper, Local Option would not be granted for Toronto and other cities which voted in favor of Government sale. Prohibitionists must take the Premier at his word when he said that should the Ontario Temperance Act have a majority he would see that the Act would be enforced and the weak spots strengthened. If he carries out his "personal view" and sends the bootleggers to jail without the option of a fine there will be little sympathy shown for that class of law-breakers.

NEWS NOTES

In the Supreme Court on Friday, Chief Justice R.M. Meredith sentenced Peter Smith, a former Minister of the Crown, to a term of three years in the Provincial Penitentiary. Aemilius Jarvis, the well-known financier, was at the same time sentenced to six months in jail. The above were found guilty of conspiracy to defraud the Province, and were in addition to the prison terms, sentenced to repay to the Province \$600,000.

Professional safe blowers blew the safe in the office at Thomson Bros. planing and lumber mill, Port Credit, about four o'clock Saturday morning, but were frustrated in reaching any money or securities by there being a burglar-proof safe of the latest design within the larger safe. The burglars made off before daylight before they could burn through the special burglar-proof steel. The outer safe, which was equipped with two swinging doors, was drilled and plugged with nitroglycerine. When a freight train passed the office on the C.N.R. the charge was exploded, the right door being completely blown off.

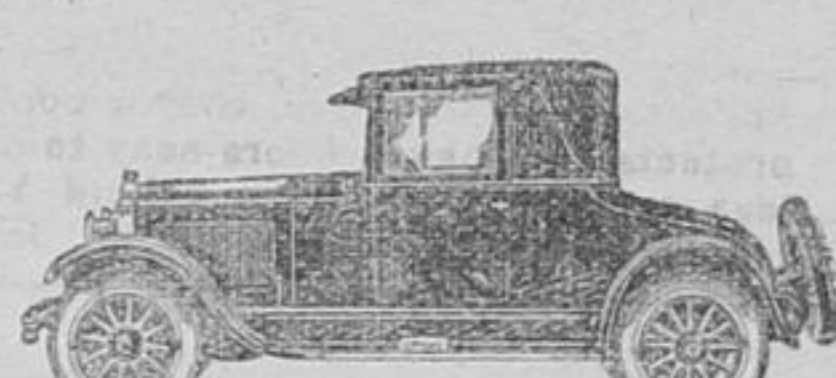
