One Minute Darkness

For the first time for about 500 years, a total eclipse of the sun will take place throughout Ontario. It will occur at seven minutes past nine on the morning of January 24th, and will last for one minute, during which time there will be complete darkness. The light will very soon begin to return, however, and by 10.22 a. m. the whole eclipse will be over. It will begin at 7.59 a. m. and gradually work up to the minute of total darkness.
