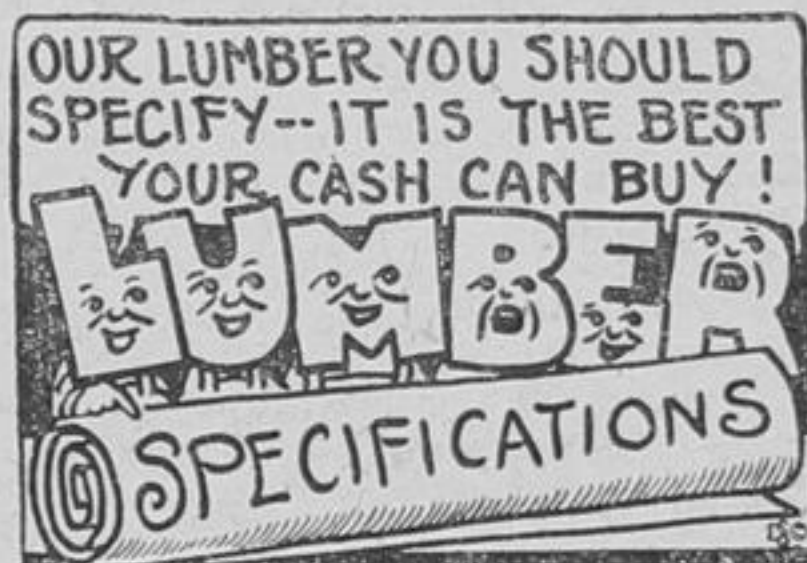

Direct Toll Service to Toronto

On and after March 21st, to telephone any number in Toronto you need
not ask for Long Distance.

Give the number wanted to your local operator just as on a local call. Do
not hang up the receiver but hold the line while connection is being estab-
lished.

Direct toll service is available only on Station-to-Station calls, that is, where
you ask for a number rather than a person. If you do not know the number,
ask "Information."

The rate is 15 cents for a three-minute talk to Toronto.

If you must speak to a particular person ask, for "Long Distance"
and give her the details of the call
