#### MARKHAM TOWNSHIP NOTICE

LOAD OF VEHICLES ACT

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that said Act provides that during the months of March and April in each year, vehicles operating or object being moved over or upon a public highway, which is not within a city or separated town, and having a carrying capacity exceeding one ton, shall not be loaded in excess of onehalf the rated carrying capacity of such vehicle or object without a permit as provided by said Act.

The Act also provides that not withstanding such permit, the owner, driveror operator of such vehicle or object, is responsible for any damage caused to a highway by such vehicle or object.

A penalty not exceeding \$100.00 is provided for a contravention of any of the provisions of said Act.
