The election of Von Hindenburg, Germany's War Lord during the late war, to the Presidency of the German Republic, is causing much uneasiness throughout Europe and the whole civilized world. And what adds to the uneasiness is the confirmed report—that the Ex-Kaiser is rejoicing over his friend's victory, hoping it may lead to a return of the Monarchy with himself at the head. It is true Von Hindenburg, before his election, pledged himself to work for world peace along Republican lines, but this remains to be seen. May this struggling old world, suffering from the effects of the last awful war, hope for the best.

RURAL MAIL CARRIERS

The Globe quite properly asks the question, why is it that rural mail carriers have to tender for their positions every few years. The Government would not think of asking letter carriers in cities to get their positions by contract. The same may be said of railway mail clerks. In the last two cases the Government sets the salary for what it thinks the work is worth, and the position is permanent. There seems to be no good reason why rural mail carriers are not treated the same as city letter carriers and railway mail clerks.

Contracts call for a certain number of miles, say every day in the week, fine weather or stormy weather. Many a faithful man loses his job because a neighbor tenders for a few dollars less. The last tender may find at the end of his contract that he has lost money by the transaction. What the Government should expect is efficient and careful service. For that they should be willing to pay a fair living wage.

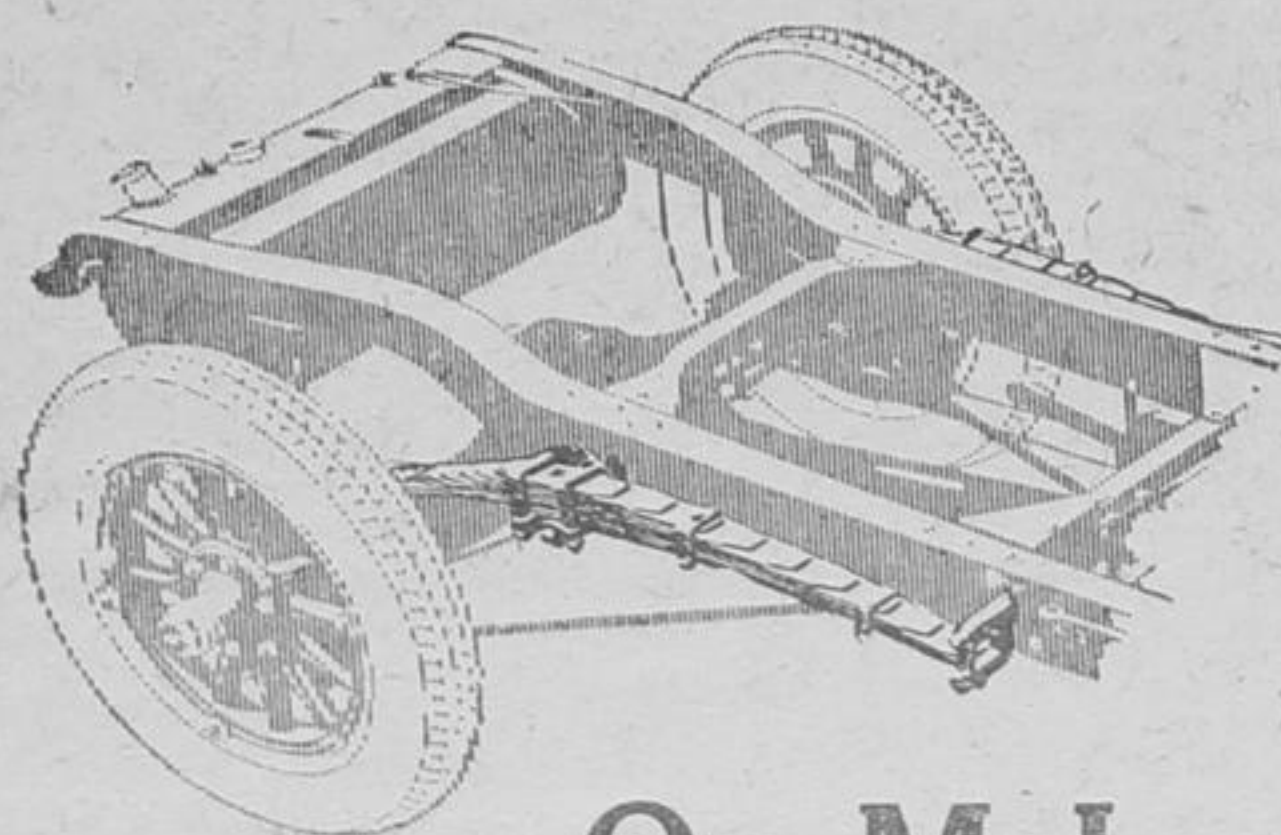
