

Do you snore? If you do, why not stop it? It's really quite easy to do so. Snoring is the result of sleeping with the mouth open, and breathing through it instead of through the nose.

Stop Snoring.

At the back of our mouths is a tis-Bridge, under the shadow of a great sue curtain called the "soft palate." When indrawn air comes against this it vibrates and makes the "music" known as snoring. The volume of sound depends on the age of the snorer -neither the young nor the very old snore and on whether some air is also being taken through the nostrils. Subsidiary causes of snoring are-

sleeping on one's back, or an obstruction of the nasal passages by adenoids or other growths. "Back sleeping," by depriving the chin of support, causes it to fall, and that induces mouthbreathing and snoring.

The cure is simple-the chin should be tied up! Snoring is then an impossibility.
