Obituary

LATE MRS. JOHN HAMILTON

The death occurred last week at 94 Hanson street of Mrs. John Hamilton at the age of 90 years who was well known in this village. The deceased was a pioneer of Uxbridge, having been born there June 26, 1836, one year prior to this date when Queen Victoria ascended the throne. Her father, Jas. Bascom, was the first postmaster in Uxbridge and all mail at that time was left in a cupboard. On January 28th, 1856 she was married to John Hamilton of Uxbridge who predeceased her in 1874 and this is the first break in this family since that time. Mrs. Hamilton is survived by seven children, forty-two grand children and great grand children, four generations in five families. Her eldest son William Hamilton has been postmaster at Uxbridge forty-five years. Dr. Bascom of Toronto is a brother and Mrs. Hewison of Richmond Hill is a daughter. The interment was made at Uxbridge.
