Victoria Square, May 26—The passing of Norma Couperthwaite, beloved wife of Roy Glover on Friday, May 21st cast a gloom over this community. After the birth of a daughter Mrs. Glover was progressing favorably when a relapse came which ended in her death. The funeral services were held from her late residence on the afternoon of the 24th. The services were in charge of the Rev. H. S. Warren of Stouffville, a former pastor who had performed the marriage some three short years past, and Rev. Mr. Wall the present pastor. After the house service interment took place at Thornhill cemetery. A large number of friends, relatives and acquaintances were present to extend sympathy to the family in their sad bereavement. The floral offerings were many and beautiful.

LATE WARREN HEWISON
In the passing of the late Warren Hewison the village loses one of its best known citizens and also one of its oldest residents. Mr. Hewison was the son of Robert Hewison and Elizabeth Warren and was born in Richmond Hill in the year 1855 and with the exception of a few years in Markham when he was learning his trade of painting and decorating he had resided in the village all his life. Warren, as he was familiarly called by his many friends, will be greatly missed in this community. He was a conscientious and highly competent workman, a good neighbour and a loyal citizen, and while his modesty would not allow him to accept any official position, he always maintained an active and intelligent interest in municipal affairs. In politics he was a life long conservative and in religion was, at the time of his decease, a member of St. Paul's United Church.

Mr. Hewison took a severe cold while attending the funeral of his wife's mother less than two weeks ago, and while nothing serious was anticipated at the time, pneumonia developed later and he passed away on Sunday morning last, leaving his wife, his adopted daughter Alberta, a sister, Mrs. Nelson Davis of Toronto, a large circle of nieces and nephews and a host of friends to mourn his departure. The funeral was held on Tuesday and was largely attended.
