Softball Notes

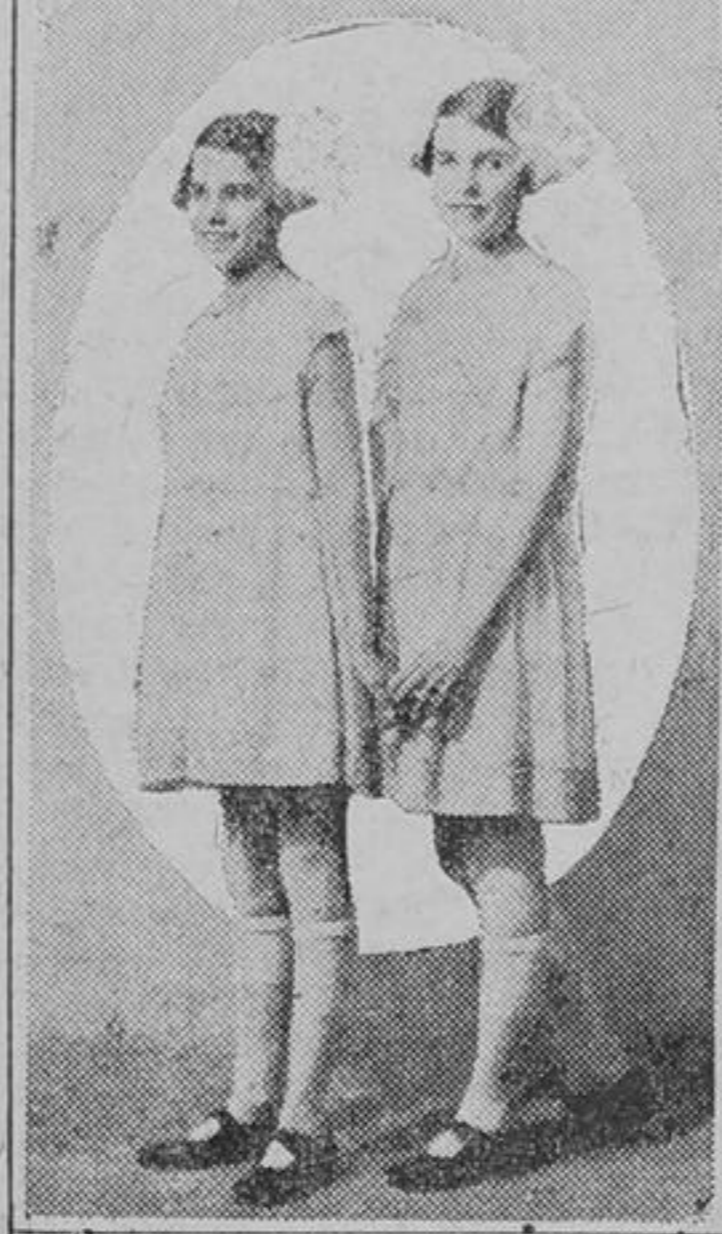
