

Low Flying Is Discouraged

Inquest Held Concerning Death of Pilot Officer Stevenson

That Pilot Officer A. W. B. Stevenson came to his death by accidental means at 9.15 o'clock on the morning of July 27th, when he struck a windmill while flying at too low an altitude and contrary to his instructions.

This was the verdict returned by the jury Monday night which was investigating the death of Pilot Officer A. W. B. Stevenson, who was killed just south of the village as the result of an aeroplane accident.

Flight-Lieut. G. E. Brooks one of the instructors at Camp Borden, said that the machine in which the young man had been flying was in perfect condition, as it had been tested by two mechanics just before

the flight. Stunting and low flying had been prohibited by the squadron commanders, and, according to information received following the accident, several cadets, including the one who accompanied Stevenson July 27, have been dismissed.

The inquest was conducted by the Coroner and the following composed the jury:—J. A. Greene (for-man.) W. H. Pugsley, C. Skeele, W. Savage, W. Scrivener, F. Sims, G. Moodie.
