Article 8 YORK

Before the white man came the area between what is now Toronto and Lake Simcoe was described as Torontona Huron Indian word meaning the meeting place. The numerous Indian burying grounds and camp sites that have been discovered in this area are mute witnesses to the fact that what is now York was indeed "an Indian meeting place."

The white man changed the descriptive word into a proper noun and spelled it Toronto and on at least one old map Lake Simcoe is named Lake Toronto and the Humber

River, Toronto River. The English changed the name of Fort Rouille to Fort Toronto and it was by this name it was known when Lieut. Gov. Simcoe selected Toronto as the site of the new Capital

of Upper Canada. But he was not pleased with the name and when the Duke of York's Army was victorious against the French in Holland he used the victory as the occasion of changing the name of the capital of Upper Canada to York.

The proclamation which we here give in full calling for the change would indicate that Governor Simcoe wished to do honor to the Duke of York and perhaps at the same time please King George III.

PROCLAMATION

York Upper Canada, August 2th, 1793 His excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, having received information of the success of His Majesty's Arms under H. R. H. the Duke of York, by which Holland has been saved from the invasion of the French Armies and it appearing that the combined forces have been successful in dislodging their enemies from an entrenched camp supposed to be impregnable, from which the most important consequence may be expected and in which the arduous attempt H. R. H. the Duke of York and His Majesty's troops supported the National Glory and it is His Excellency's orders that on the raising of the Union Flag at 12 o'clock tomorrow, a Royal Salute of 21 guns is to be fired, to be answered by the shipping in the Harbor, in respect of His Royal Highness and in commemoration of the naming of this Harbor from His title York.

In 1817 York was given self-Government and upon the population reaching 9,000, it was on March 6th, 1834 incorporated as a City under the former name, Toronto.

Although for forty years the official name was York yet the usual term applied when refering to this new settlement was "Little York" or "Muddy York."

The first surveys at York, outside of the Capital were Yonge Street and Eglinton Avenue, which were the base lines for future surveys, and the first township outlined was the Township of Dublin but later the township name was changed first to Toronto and then to York in conformity

with the Capital name. The School in School Section No. 16, York West (now North York) situated on the Lansing Side Road is known as the "Dublin School" and as this locality was one of the first in York to be settled, I sometimes think the name of the Dublin School is a memory from the early days when the Township of York was know as the Township of Dublin.

When the survey of the townships between Lake Ontario and Lake Simcoe was completed an electoral district within the Home District was named York and Later Ontario, York and Peel formed a County in Upper Canada, but it was not until 1851 that York was formed into a separate County, consisting of the townships of Etobicoke, York, Scarboro, Markham, Vaughan, King, Whitchurch, Gwillimbury East and Gwillimbury North.

The counties of Ontario, York and Peel were united for county purposes until 1853 when Ontario separated In 1856 the present County Buildings were constructed and have been continuously for seventy years the home of the County of York Offices and the meeting place of the

County Council. Until the opening of the present City Hall of Toronto on Sept. 18th 1899 which also serves as the Court House of Toronto and York, these buildings were also the Court

House for the United Judicial District of Toronto and York. On January 1st, 1867 Peel and York separated and H.S. Howland of Vaughan was elected Warden of York and the Municipalities within the county were the townships included in 1851 and the Township of Georgina and the Villages of Yorkville, Newmarket, Holland Landing and Aurora.

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
