MAKE SURE YOUR NAME IS REGISTERED

A little timely advice to every elector at the present time is, "if you want to vote at the election on Sept. 14th, make sure that your name is on the voters' list." There is rarely a campaign when some citizen does not come forward at the last minute and complain that their name had been left off the list. That your name was on last time is not sufficient, you must make sure that it is on this time.

Registrars are already at work preparing the lists and certain days for the addition of new names will no doubt be sufficiently advertised by party workers in due time.

The general rule applying to the qualification of voters is that every person in Canada, male or female is qualified to vote, and should be included in the lists if he or she is: "1. A British Subject; 2. Twenty-one years of age; 3. has resided in Canada for the year immediately preceding the date of the issue of the writ of elections; 4. was resident in the riding at a date two months before the issue of the writ, (May 21st.)"

Following is the regulation covering advance polls: Railway employee, sailor or commercial traveller whose employment requires his absence from home on election day, is entitled to vote at the advance polls providing his name is on the list of voters. Persons wishing to vote at the advance polls must receive from the revising officer a certificate upon which he may vote in his electoral district. The right to a certificate is not limited to persons employed by railway company, or a seaman or to commercial travellers, but extends to all persons employed in travelling for purpose of commerce.

LOCAL IMPROVEMENT NOTICE

Avenue Road Watermain

Local Improvement Notice
Don Boulevard Bridge

Take Notice That:

1. The council of the corporation of the Township of North York intend to construct as a local improvement a reinforced concrete bridge, over the west branch of the Don River on Don Boulevard and intends to especially assess a part of the cost of the land abutting directly on the work and upon the following land which is to be immediately benefited by the work—both sides of Don Boulevard from 30th.
