SEASONABLE RECIPES

Cucumber Catsup

Three large cucumbers, one large onion, two tablespoons grated horseradish, 2 tablespoons salt, 2 cups vinegar, 2 tablespoons black pepper, 1 teaspoon paprika. Grate cucumber and onion or put through mincer, add remaining ingredients, boil five minutes, bottle and seal.

Canned String Beans

Wash and cut beans in inch pieces. Add water enough to cover, and to each quart of beans add one teaspoonful of cream of tartar. Boil 20 minutes and setl in fruit jars. When using them pour off the water, rinse well in cold water and cook in the usual way adding one teaspoon baking soda to each quart of beans.

Beet Relish

Five boiled beets, two small heads of cabbage, chop separately. Add 1 cup horseradish, 1 cup sugar, 3 tablespoons salt, 2 tablespoons mustard, 1/2 promptly and cheer- teaspoon red pepper and four cups cold vinegar.

Veal Loaf

Mix thoroughly three and one half pounds veal chopped fine, 3 eggs, salt better acquainted and at the same time Thorough Eye Examinations fine bread crumbs, butter size of an egg, melted, and tablespoons cream.

Brown Bread

One and one half cups white flour, two and one half cups Graham flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon soda, 1 tablespoon sugar: 1 pint sour milk. Bake in moderate oven for one hour
