## County Council

York County Council resumed its sessions on Tuesday of this week with all the representatives of this district present.

To discuss the construction of a proposed high level bridge at Hogg's Hollow during 1927, a deputation was appointed to wait on the Hon. G. S. Henry, Minister of Highways, Friday afternoon. The deputation will comprise—Reeve Gohn, Markham, Reeve Legge, Aurora, Reeve Pugsley Sutton Reeve Tier, Etobicoke, Deputy Reeve Muirhead, North York and the county commissioners.

Strong condemnation of the accommodation provided for inmates in the York Industrial Home, situated on North Yonge Street, near Newmarket, was made by Doctor J. H. Wesley, the home physician, and the Industrial Home Commissioners at the afternoon session of York County Council Tuesday. Dr. Wesley contended that larger accommodation was needed as were better hospital facilities.

The Industrial Home Commissioners, Messrs. G. Kellam and W. Riddell in their report, which was adopted, said: "We find the men's sleeping

rooms filled to capacity and the room used for those sick and confined to their beds inadequate."

They reported that on December first there were in the home 92 inmates, 2 men and 20 women, of whom 1 are bed-fast and four over 90 years of age. During the year 39 were committed and six died. The commissioners spoke well of the services of Inspector Spaulding and said that the home was well and efficiently managed.

#### TAKE NOTICE THAT:—

1. The Council of the Corporation of the Township of North York, in tends to construct as a local improvement a reinforced concrete bridge 18 feet wide, over the west branch of the Don River on Don Boulevard, and intends to specially assess a part of the cost upon the following land which is to be immediately benefited by the work.

A. Both sides of Don Blvd. from 200 feet north of the north street line of 30th Avenue, west to the north limit of Lot 24, Plan 2069.

B. Part of Township Lot 16, Con. 1 west, abutting on the north limit of the street.

2. The estimated cost of the work is \$5,500.00 of which \$2,750.00 is to be paid by the Corporation.
