The inspector instructed that these matters be regulated. Mr. Davies wanted to know whether or not slaughter houses supplying local butchers with meat were inspected. Nothing of this nature has ever been done in the past but it was agreed that it was in the interests of public health that such should be done. It was pointed out that the regulations regarding slaughter houses were quite exacting and should be

carried out. The government report of two tests made of local milk supply showed a test of 3.7 and 3.4 butter fat on two occasions this year. This is considerably above the required standard which is 3.25.

A report from the Provincial Department showed the town water tested on February 16 to be of very good quality.
