People who endeavor to keep nice lawns and gardens are said to have very interesting views on the subject.

Oh yes, the motorist sighed, the ruts are gone but the holes in Yonge Street which we bumped over last year are still there. If it isn't one thing it's bound to be another.

Assurance has been given by the Treasury Department that the miniature five-cent silver pieces that have been in general use for the past 63 years in Canada are to be withdrawn from circulation and replaced by a large nickel coin, a quantity of which was put in circulation in 1921. As Canada has practically a monopoly on nickel, it would appear to be quite a seemly matter to continue the nickel piece, but it will take a long time to make it popular with the people. It resembles the 25 cent silver coin too closely.

The Ontario Legislature has passed a bill making it compulsory on land owners in cities as well as rural parts to cut down and destroy patches of noxious weeds growing on their property. The act provides for the appointment of inspectors in every municipality, who must before the 15 of June each year send a notice to every resident of what weeds on his place require attention. Penalties from \$20 to \$50 are provided for.

Forty residents of Oakville were summoned and appeared before the magistrate for not shovelling their snow. Each was fined \$1.00 and costs. It might work other places.

A carcass of baby beef aged 16 months recently purchased by an Orillia butcher, weighed 760 pounds dressed.

Rev. Mr. Pyley of Elora, has a daffodil of which the length of the stalk is 23 inches from bulb to top of stalk. The flower is 5 inches in diameter, with white petals and yellow centre.

Mr. John Campbell, 10th line, Vaughan who is giving up farming, will sell his stock and implements by auction on Tuesday, March 22nd.

Nature still continues to turn out freaks of all kinds but the latest in this district is a pig without any feet. The other Sunday a sow belonging to Mr. Willis Johnston, 2nd concession, Elma gave birth to a litter of eight little pigs. When the feet were given out there was evidently not enough to go around, for one of the little fellows was left without any. This youngster is still alive and thriving. —Listowel Banner.

The town of Whitby has \$10,232 taxes outstanding in the 1926 roll, from a total of \$103,324. Showing 9 per cent. still to gather.

Messrs. Geo. Watson and Ira Anderson shipped ten extra fine horses from Stouffville last week to Toronto, to fill a private order. The animals all ranged around 1600 pounds, and a price reaching about \$200 a head was paid in some instances but they were among the best animals in the locality, and thus demanded a fancy figure.

Norman Baker, an Uxbridge rural mail carrier, faces a charge of stealing from his Majesty's mails, and is now out on bail. He was arrested as the result of investigations conducted by detectives of the Post Office Department at Ottawa.

The auction sale of Geo. Forrester and Son, Markham Township, held recently is reported to have realized over \$5,000.

Several farmers of the district have been toting sawlogs to Card's mill at Nashville to be cut into lumber. Campbell Armstrong turned in four logs of "soft" elm of great size from one tree, the largest measuring in diameter five and one-half feet one way and five feet the other way.—Bolton Enterprise.

To Tax Unmarried Men
Councillor Geo. Todd at the meeting of the Uxbridge Township Council made a good move when he gave notice of the introduction of a by-law at the next meeting to place a poll tax on all unmarried men in the township who are not property owners. The rest of the Council gave their unanimous support to the introduction of the by-law. There is no doubt that a majority of these young men use the roads and pay nothing for their upkeep, whereas the married man has to pay either rent or taxes on his farm and in many a case bring up a family.

The annual Provincial Convention of the Ontario Prohibition Union opened in Massey Hall, Toronto on Wednesday, March 16th.

The Highway Department has issued instructions to the Highway officers that all loads carried on the highway must be kept down to half weight during March and April. Trucks will be weighed at different intervals during these months.
