At a meeting of the Brock Monument Committee, held at Queenston on the 14th, in pursuance of the adjourned meeting held in Toronto on the 8th inst., the following resolutions were proposed and unanimously adopted. Sir Alan MacNab was called to the chair, and Capt. Munro appointed Secretary.

Proposed by the Hon. James Kerby, 1st Regiment of Welland, seconded by Colonel McDougall, 1st Lincoln Regiment :

(1) Resolved, that in the opinion of the meeting the time has now arrived for carrying into effect the wishes of the contributors for rebuilding the monument to the memory of the late Major-General Sir Isaac Brock, and which fund now amounts to £5,794. Carried unanimously.

Moved by David Thorburn, Esq., seconded by Lieutenant Garrett, late 49th Regiment :

(2) Resolved, that a committee be appointed to realize such portions of the money now invested in the Bank of Upper Canada, from time to time, as may be required for the building of the said monument, and that the following gentlemen do compose such committee : Chief Justice Robinson, Thomas C. Street, J. G. Ridout, Esquires. Carried unanimously.

Proposed by Hon. H. Merritt, seconded by Walter Dickson, Esq. :

(3) Resolved, that the sum of £25 be paid for the best plan to be approved of by the committee appointed to superintend the building of Brock's monument, with working plans and estimates. The stones contained in the present monument to form a part of the material for the new one. Said plans, estimates, etc., to be submitted to the building committee on the 2nd day of August next, at the inn of Joseph Wynn, in the town of Queenston. Carried unanimously.

Proposed by Walter Dickson, Esq., seconded by the Hon. H. Merritt :

(4) Resolved, that the name of Col. McDougall be added to the building committee. Carried unanimously.
