General News and Views

A fine registered mare belonging to Harold Wright at Mongolia, committed an unprecedented act for a horse the other day, when it cut its own throat and nearly bled to death, before the veterinary could be summoned. Mr. Wright was in the stable at the time and hearing a strange knocking on the manger went to investigate, when he saw the gaping wound in the animal's neck, it having got down in the stall. Evidently the accident had just occurred, and had Mr. Wright not been present the mare would have died in a few moments.

How the horse cut itself is a mystery to the veterinary and anyone else who has investigated the incident. There are no nails on which it might be injured and the animal had no corks on her shoes. It is generally agreed however that it must have done the deed with its foot in some manner. Only recently Mr. Wright sold this mare's colt for \$190.

There is an agitation in one quarter of Whitechurch Township to have the municipality divided into seven polling sub-divisions, instead of six as it is now constituted, and the matter may prove to be the basis of a lively debate at the May meeting of the council.

Palmerston Council has passed a by-law making it illegal for milk to be sold in the municipality unless it is from accredited cows.

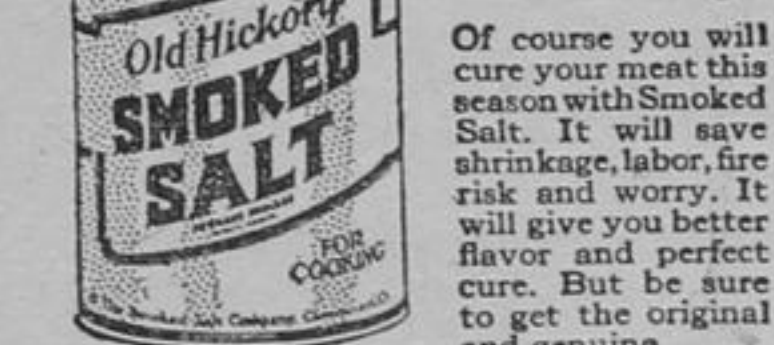
