GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

The Ontario Government has no intention this year of providing a standard lamp for use under the "lights" on all vehicles" legislation, which becomes effective on October 1. There has been some agitation for a standard light, and, in fact, Premier Ferguson intimated last spring that the Government might be able to bring one out for sale at a minimum cost, but apparently the idea is not as feasible as it then appeared, and it has been abandoned for the time being at least.

Under this new legislation every vehicle other than a motor vehicle or a bicycle or tricycle, when on a highway after dusk and before dusk must carry in a conspicuous position on the left side thereof a lighted lamp showing white to the front and red to the rear, and visible at a distance of at least 200 feet. The department of highways has reserved the right, however, to sanction use of reflectors on vehicles engaged in transporting inflammable materials.

You're not safe any more even in the bath tub in the sacred precincts of your home. And if you're standing on a stepladder its practically an odds-on bet you'll get hurt. Observe what the statistics of an insurance company says: Last year out of 33-303 claims paid, 98 went out to persons injured in bath tubs, and 36 to those who had fallen from ladders. Another feature of the reports is that more men are injured in the comparatively mild sports of fishing, golf, tennis and gymnasium exercising than in the more active game of football.

The main street of the village of Palgrave, was given a second coating of salt last week. This salt is used in place of oil to eliminate the dust nuisance, and preserve the surface of the road. It was used last year for the first time, and was found to be very satisfactory.

Good progress is being made in widening the Yonge Street Highway south from Aurora to Bond Lake, and also north of the town near St. Andrew's College. Huge machinery is being used to carve the high banks away on the west side of the roadway, and the earth taken is being used to make fills in the valleys. The road was particularly narrow and dangerous at these points. The width will also accommodate double tracking for the radials if this is decided upon for the future.

A lad of nine summers who was spending his holidays on the farm of Mr. Earl Weddel, south of Sharon, was nearly killed last Friday morning by a kick from a horse.

So that she may be married, a girl in France, is trying to prove that she was born. She applied for a birth certificate, which is required before a marriage license can be issued, but officials are unable to find any trace of her advent in the world having been registered, due probably to her parents' negligence. She was informed that officially she was not alive, and the wedding had to be postponed.

Bee-keeping as a branch of farming is rapidly increasing in Canada. In 1921 total production for the Dominion was 7,000,000 pounds, while last year it amounted to 21,000,000, a three-fold increase in a 5-year period. Financial return to bee-keepers in 1925 was \$4,100,000. Ontario and Quebec are the chief centres of the industry, with Manitoba in third place. Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia farmers are establishing apiaries in increasing numbers every year, and the West promises to soon overtake the Eastern Provinces in the matter of production. The Saskatchewan department of agriculture has appointed a specialist in agriculture to advise the bee-keepers of that Province regarding the intricacies of the business, thus recognizing its importance as a feature of farm enterprise.
