GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

A Record

W. W. Woods, of Woodbridge, has a bred-to-lay Barred Rock pullet, hatched on May 15th, and on Friday, September 2nd, laid her first egg, a normal sized one at that, and has since continued to function right along. This figures out exactly three months and eighteen days, and local and outside experts think that the performance of the Woodbridge pullet constitutes a new record among the Barred Rock or any other breeds.

G. A. M. Davison Won Many Prizes At Ex.

Some time records have been made by York County farmers and breeders at the Canadian National Exhibition in horses and cattle, not to mention other live stock classes.

In the pony breeding classes, an outstanding winner is G. A. M. Davison, of Unionville, who with White-gate Emblem, won the championship and grand championship, together with the open class for all harness stallions. He won first and second for 2 year old fillies, Marigold and Britannia, with junior championship and reserve grand championship for Marigold, and first for foal for 1927. In the harness horses and pairs Mr. Davison was equally successful, winning the championship for harness pony and Canadian pony.

A former president of the Markham Fair and a member of the directorate of the Canadian National Exhibition, Mr. Davison is keenly alive to the need of maintaining a high standard in the breeding and development of Canadian horses and ponies.

Armistice Week

It was decided at a well attended meeting of the North York branch of the Canadian Legion, to hold an Armistice Week, commencing November 6th. Throughout the week dances, euvres, and draws will be staged, and a memorial service held on November 11. The auditor's report in connection with the last Poppy Day fund was found satisfactory. Eight new members were enrolled, bringing the total membership to 98. J. J. Dugdan was appointed to the entertainment committee and F. T. Bridge, convener of the refreshment committee.

Barn Burned

Fire from some unknown cause which broke out in the extensive barns and outbuildings of Warren G. Wilson, on the Markham and Scarborough townline, on Wednesday last, utterly destroyed the big bank barn and adjoining buildings, together with all the season's crop from 150 acres, entailing a loss estimated anywhere from \$12,000 to \$15,000. The fire, a spectacular one, lit up the countryside for miles around, and scores of neighbors, together with the Unionville Volunteer Fire Brigade did everything possible to stay the progress of the flames and save the residence, which they were successful in doing. Mr. Wilson had practically finished drawing in the season's crop, which, together with a quantity of fowl, hogs and implements, went up in smoke.

Farm House Destroyed

The farm house of G. Near, on the third concession of Whitechurch, was destroyed by fire this week. Part of the furniture was saved. The blaze is thought to have been started by a threshing engine. The Aurora fire truck was rushed to the fire, but was unable to cope with the flames, which had gained great headway. The loss will amount to about \$4,000.

Winter Prices

J. P. Griffin, secretary-treasurer of the Ontario Milk and Cream Producers' Association, said to-day that the present prices of milk which went into effect on September 1 will be retained until May 1 next, unless unforeseen conditions arise. The price on September 1 was raised to the producer from \$1.95 per eight-gallon can to \$2.20. This, in turn, resulted in the increase in the retail price of 15 instead of 16 pint tickets for a dollar. This latter has been the winter price in all the big centres of Ontario for the last three years.

Woodbridge Resident Passes

The death of Mrs. Jessie Stevenson Bagg on Thursday last at the early age of 46 years, removes one who was very widely known and

highly respected. Mrs. Bagg was a daughter of the late James A. Stevenson, and was born in Vaughan Township where she resided up to the time of her removal to Woodbridge, about 15 years ago. Besides her husband and one son, Lorne, she is survived by one brother, Kenneth, of Vaughan Township, and four sisters, Mrs. John Whitmore, of Woodbridge; Mrs. D. Edgar Hutchinson, and another residing at Chatham. Mrs. Bagg's illness extended over a considerable time. She was a member of the Woodbridge Presbyterian Church.

Pedlar Fined

A case came before the police magistrate at Cobourg which effects the country merchants. A man was selling tea from house to house and claimed to be a manufacturer, because he blended tea, and a manufacturer is exempt by law. The magistrate took a sensible view of the case and registered a stiff fine. If more sensible interpretations of the law were administered there would be less interference with the business of the tax-paying store of the small towns and villages.

Roads For The North

During the next two years the Department of Lands and Forests proposes to spend about a quarter of a million dollars on highways in the Port Arthur—Kenora—Fort Frances section of northwestern Ontario, according to an announcement made by Hon. William Finlayson, on his return from a tour of inspection of that district.
