- After setting and removing stakes no assistance will be allowed in classes, 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 10, 11.
- All lots drawn by ballot.
- All plowmen to be on the field and make entries sharp at 8 o'clock ready to commence work at 9 o'clock. Entries will be received up until 8 o'clock only on the morning of the match—plowmen please note this rule.
- Special for horses, horses and harness not necessarily to be owned by the plowman.
- The association will not be responsible for prizes not called for before January 1st, 1928.
- No attachments may be used on mould boards, skimmers may be used.
