CHANGE IN HUNTING SEASON

Deer and Moose The Ontario Government have announced a change in the open season for deer and moose this year, in that, either animal may be taken in the district south of the French and Mattawa Rivers from November 1st to November 30th, and in the district north of the French and Mattawa from October 10th to November 30th. These periods are very much in favor of the Hunter, especially if the weather may turn cold, and it is trusted the action of the Government will result in a marked increase in the number of those taking to the woods.
