GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

Next Monday is Hallowe'en.

Up in Cobalt the tax rate is eighty mills and for separate school supporters 103 mills. Did we hear someone on the station platform say taxes were high?

Get your lights on your horse and steam-drawn vehicles now. The law is very explicit and "safety first" demands it for your own protection from accident.

The post mortem performed on the contents of the stomach of the late Adam Yake, jeweler of Stouffville, who died under peculiar circumstances at Markham village on October 17th, reveal the certainty of the statement made by Yake before his death, that he had been drinking wood alcohol.

Work of building the new highway from north of Sunderland to Orillia was commenced last week and a considerable improvement is already noticeable where the scarifying has been done.

Fred Timbers, of Stouffville had a very successful week at the International Plowing Match, held on the Municipal Farm at Langstaff. In addition to having the honors that go with winning the Ontario championship, he won during the three days of the provincial competitions in cash \$113, and \$135 in goods and trophies, a total of \$248.

Township Constable Thomas Draycott of the Scarborough Police force sustained a fractured ankle and numerous cuts and bruises when he was knocked off his motorcycle by an automobile last week. F. W. McCaul of Gerrard St., East Toronto, ran into the constable with his car when both were turning the corner of Birchmount and Danforth. McCaul was arrested for reckless driving.

The new Essex County Jail, completed a year ago, and calculated to serve for at least a decade, is crowded beyond capacity, and prisoners are sleeping on cots in the corridors as the result of the latest prohibition and anti-gambling drive by Canadian Border police. This announcement was forthcoming Saturday from William A. Wanless, Governor of the Jail, who added: "The congestion is bothersome now, of course, but there is nothing to stop the authorities from adding several floors to the edifice if they choose." Bootleggers of the Windsor area convicted on selling charges since Sept. 1, comprise quite a colony in themselves at the county lock-up, and their number has been augmented from day to day.

Mr. David Jeffrey has disposed of his hundred acre farm adjoining the village of Schomberg, together with his stock, implements and crop, to Mr. Norman Elgie, formerly of Grand Valley, who has taken possession. The price paid was twenty thousand dollars. Mr. Jeffrey will remove to Toronto.

Large families are not altogether extinct in this section, although they are anything but common. Mr. and Mrs. Fred Banks who live about a mile south of Ringwood were greeted with a new baby girl in their family on Sunday, the infant being the eleventh child living, and the twelfth to be born to them. Enough Canadian families like this and the emigration problem would be solved for this country in a short time, as well as the farm help problem.—Stouffville Tribune.

Elizabeth Plummer a dressmaker, has entered suit against the Hon. Geo. S. Henry, Minister of Highways, for \$10,000 damages.

No blacksmith in Canada has ever earned so high a reputation as James Ley, of Markham, as an expert in making and adjusting plows especially for the fine work demanded in plowing competitions. He has made and repaired and adjusted plows for nearly all the champion plowmen in Canada.

As our Government does not recognize the Soviet, the United States Weather Bureau cannot get the data.

Utilization of the earth's internal fires for heat and power, predicted at the meeting of the British Scientists' Association, is already practiced on American soil. In the Hawaii National Bank at Honolulu the Superintendent's office is warmed—when warmth is needed—by natural heat drawn from the Kilauea volcano.
