GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

The district was treated to the first snow storm of the year over the holiday week end. The ground was blanketed with snow but was not nearly as heavy as in some sections of the province.

The potato market has taken a slump, and tubers are being loaded at Goodwood at \$1.25 bag. The previous price was \$1.50. Cabbage is going out in large quantities at \$11 ton from Stouffville station.

A total of 600,000,000 cigarettes are said to be smuggled into Canada each year. Just think what an amount of good Canadian money goes up in American smoke.

Ontario is to have a balanced Budget, but maybe it is at the expense of too many unbalanced pedestrians.

Carelessness on the part of drivers tends to increase the cost of automobile accident insurance.

Having paid off twenty-nine million dollars of Canada's war indebtedness, the Dominion Government should take care not to find in the fact a reason for incurring a new obligation.

Payment of interest in full for the first time by the T. and N.O. Railway is a tribute to the development of the northern part of the province.

Maple Valley certainly knows how to put up a fowl supper. Last Friday they had one there and used 85 geese, served over 1,000 people and took in \$500 at the door.

A record price in Western Canada for a ram was paid last week at the annual sale arranged by the Manitoba Sheep Breeders held at Brandon. The ram, owned by the Manitoba Agricultural College, was sold to T. Lytle of Hamiota for \$200.

Orillia had a "Dollar Day" recently which is reported as a great success. If the Board of Trade, or some similar organization, was revived perhaps our merchants might co-operate in a similar manner and show the buying public that there is still mercantile life in this district.

When the engine of his tractor threshing outfit became overheated, Ross Lewis, received severe burns about the arm and face. In order to allow the radiator to cool off more quickly Ross undertook to remove the radiator cap when the escaping steam shot into his face before he could move out of the way. He was quite severely scalded about the face and arm, so that his both eyes were almost closed for some days after the accident. The unfortunate occurrence happened while Mr. Lewis was threshing for Jake Reesor on the 9th con. of Markham.

According to the latest report from the world of research, the ordinary milk weed that we see growing on the pasture is likely to become a source of good profit to the farmer. One-half acre of this weed recently produced two pounds of rubber.

Higher education in Canada is carried on in twenty-three universities and eighty-three colleges with a total student registration of over 60,000.

There are 12,370 post offices in Canada, 284,000 miles of telegraph lines and over 1,000,000 telephones with a three-million wire mileage.

The national debt of Canada decreased by \$70,189,814 in the first half of the current fiscal year, that is from April 1 to September 30, 1927.

Sixty years ago the total dairy products in Canada was less than \$15,000,000. In 1926 the total value of dairy products in the Dominion was \$241,069,320.

Canadian agriculture rests upon an unusually generous endowment of cultivable lands. Of the 300,000,000 acres believed to be suitable for farming only 60,000,000 acres are under cultivation. The 240,000,000 acres awaiting the plough are capable of sustaining many added millions of population. Despite the rapid advance of settlement in recent years, there are at present in Western Canada 25,000,000 acres of unoccupied lands situated within fifteen miles of the railways and available for purchase at prices ranging usually from \$15 to \$20 an acre.

New Law in Force

The new law doing away with the amusement tax on all tickets of twenty-five cents and less came into force on November 1st.

Regarding exemptions for patriotic, charitable, religious and educational entertainments are exempt from amusement tax, nor are any churches, societies or organizations, etc. exempt from collecting amusements tax if an admission is charged, or, if after admission, a charge is made or fee collected, unless prior to the holding of the entertainment a letter has been obtained from this department granting exemption.

Police "Went to It"

Provincial police officers under inspectors Stringer and Rae, last week, visited the farm of George Forsythe, West Gwillimbury, brother of the late Dan Forsythe, and figuratively turned the barn inside out in a search for \$2,700 missing bonds, alleged to have been stolen by the robber slain by Alec Hodge. Their search, however, was unrewarded.

Five officers, with pitch-forks, scoured every nook and corner of the barn and for a time the building presented a scene of a veritable hive of industry. They took off their coats and "went to it."
