Railway companies say the average cost of stopping a freight train is \$1.30; of course if you stop it at a level crossing with your motor car the cost is much greater.

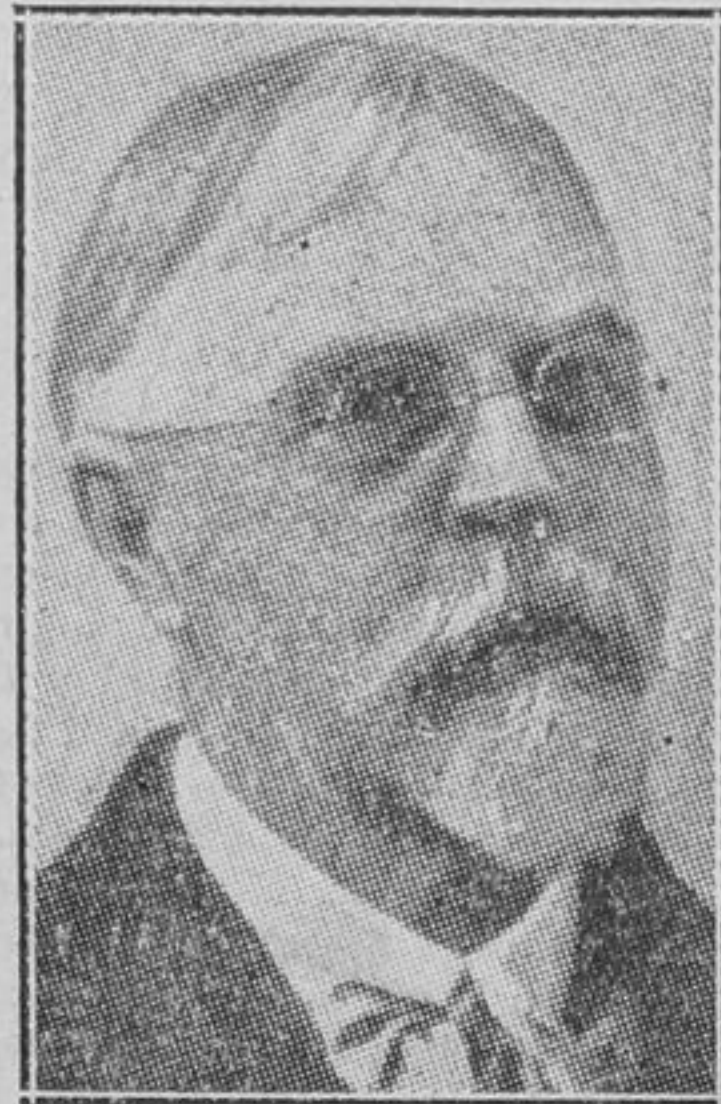
A scientist estimates that one-tenth of the world's noise is contributed by babies. A goodly proportion of the other nine-tenths is provided by some members of parliament.
