## GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

Ontario had an increase of 28 per cent. in the number of tourists from the United States from January 1st to November 1st. According to a federal report a total of 11,423,500 entered Canada and of these 8,550,000 came to Ontario. Many of them, of course, passed on to other parts of Canada but the bulk spent their money here. Assuming that the average holiday is one week at a minimum cost of \$50 and that 6,000,000 of the total entering Ontario stayed here, the sum left in the province by them would be \$300,000,000, during the ten months.

The new addition to Stouffville school building will be completed this week.

It has been reported that some unauthorized man has been through the country representing himself as an officer of the law and collecting \$5.00 from farmers who have not lights attached to their vehicles. Anyone approached in this way should report the matter to the nearest police station. Fines are not collected in this way and no one has been authorized to take any action with regard to the requirements of lights on horse drawn vehicles.

Major Geo. B. Little first deputy reeve of Scarborough, who it is understood will contest the reeveship at the coming municipal elections. Major Little is well known throughout the district and was active in political circles some years ago.

The annual banquet of York County Council tendered to Warden W. M. Graham at the King Edward Hotel last Friday evening was the most successful banquet ever held by York County Council.

For the second time in forty-one years ladies were present at the banquet, which was attended by over six hundred guests from all sections of the county.

H. J. Kirby was elected President of the Young Liberal's Club of Toronto at a meeting held in the King Edward Hotel Monday night. There was a very large attendance, and the new officers pledged themselves to expend every effort toward making the year one of unusual activity.

Rev. W. A. Cameron, in preaching Sunday night to 3,000 people in Lowe's Uptown theatre, made an appeal to the young people to live clean lives. "If drunkenness, profligacy and immorality are the diseases cursing this city or nation today it is because the young people first invite them. A new nation can arise cleansed of all sin, if you young people wish it."

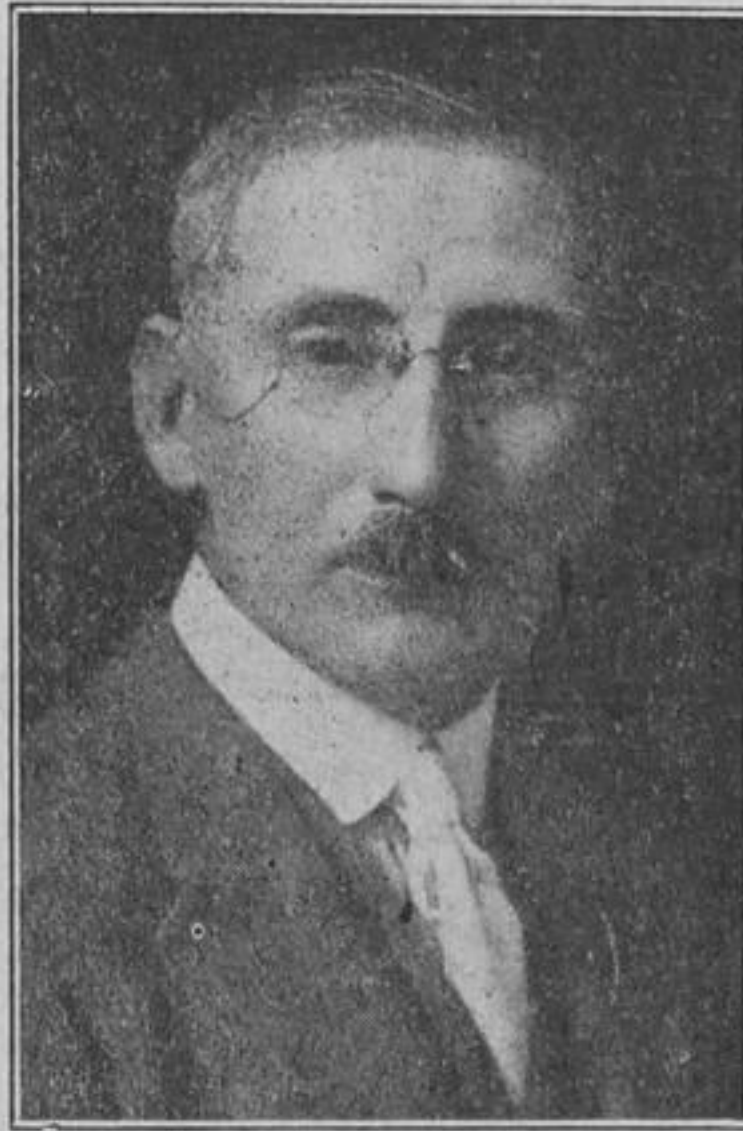
