Whether or not other candidates will be forthcoming on nomination day cannot now be definitely stated although there are several names prominently mentioned as probable starters. Councillor J.R. Herrington who has served two years in the council will seek re-election. There is a possibility that Councillor Gordon Sloan will retire although his many friends are anxious that he should stay in the municipal field. Councillor W. G. Baldock is also undecided as to his intentions and it is not known what Councillor McLeans intentions are in regards to the coming year.
