**Teachers Do Honor
To Inspector Trench**

On Friday evening, December 16th, a large number of teachers from what was formerly inspectorate No. 3, York County, gathered at the residence of Mr. W. W. A. Trench, their former Inspector. Mr. A. A. McQuarrie, Principal of S. S. No. 8, Scarborough read the following address to Mr. Trench and presented to him on behalf of the teachers a beautiful gold wrist watch on the reverse side of which was engraved “Presented to W. W. A. Trench by the teachers of No. 3, Inspectorate York County, 1927.” Mrs. Reece, Principal of S. S. No. 15, Scarborough presented to Mrs. Trench a large bouquet of fine chrysanthemums.

Mr. Trench, who had no inkling of this visit expressed in his reply appreciation of the visit of his former teachers thanked them for their beautiful token of good feeling and for their words of goodwill. He spoke with regret of the severance of the ties of friendship which he held dear, caused by the recent re-division of the schools of York County among the Inspectors, and hoped that the teachers would feel free to repeat the visit to his home frequently.

Mrs. Trench in her reply expressed her appreciation of the thoughtful remembrance of the teachers to her and assured them of a welcome at any time they could see their way to come to see her again.

Following the presentation a very pleasant social evening was enjoyed.

Dear Mr. Trench:—
We, the teachers of No. 3 York Inspectorate of 1927, have realized with keen regret that you, our former Inspector, have severed relationship with us.

We learned to look upon your official visits as days of helpfulness to us. With your words of sympathy, encouragement and praise we felt we had in you a true friend. And then at our conventions, when we heard those words of praise from you about your teachers as a whole, we always went back to our work with the inspiration to do our utmost to make the standard of our inspectorate second to none.
