Life insurance policies averaging \$27,000,000 in prospective benefits are sold in the United States every day.

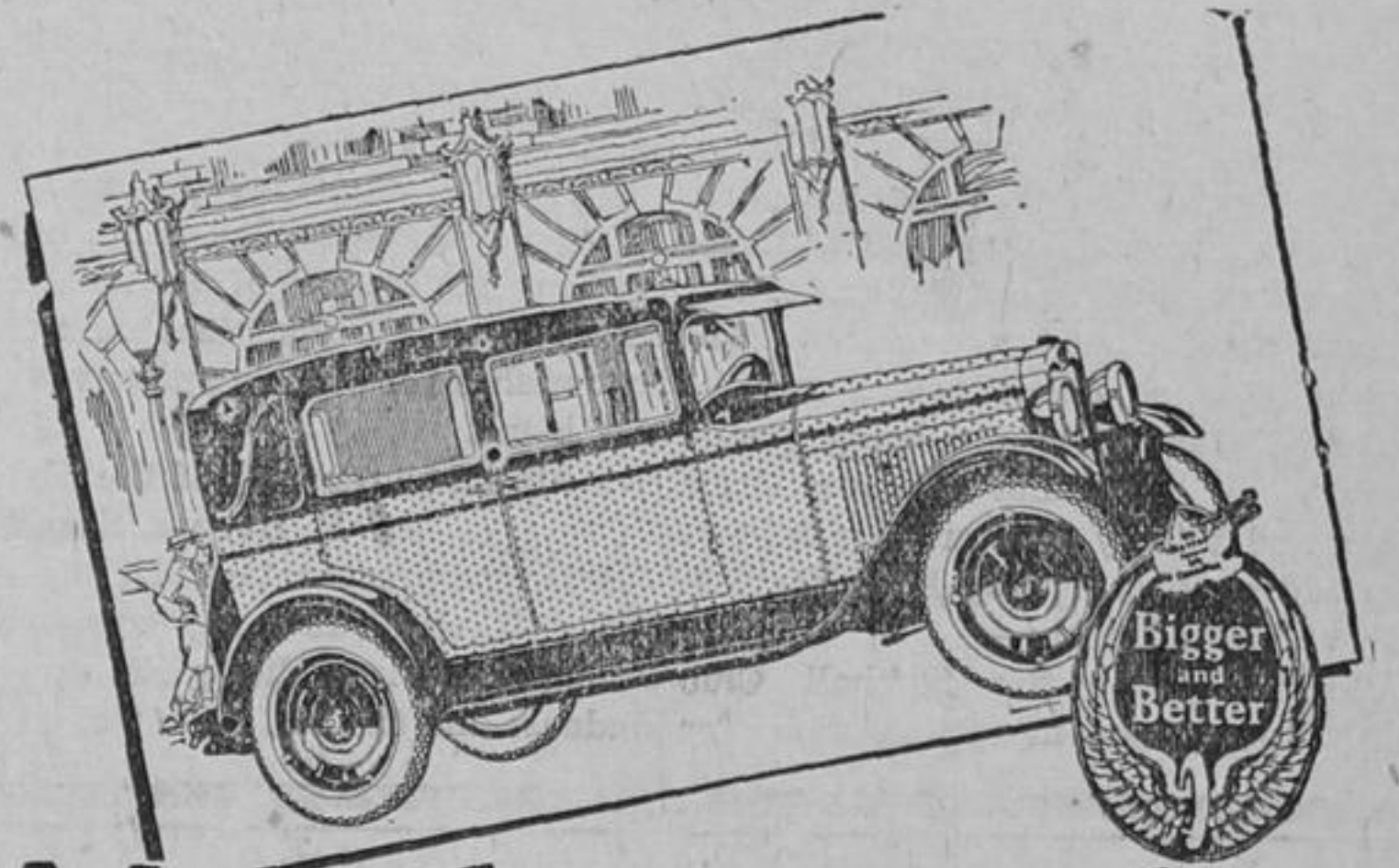
