

**Cannot Fortell Sex From The Shape of Eggs**  
Do long, slim eggs hatch out a high percentage of cockerels, and short, round eggs more pullets? Many people believe that they do.  
This point was investigated some years ago by Lewis Clark of Port Hope, one of the leaders in establishment large scale poultry keeping on a business basis in this province. He selected 1,000 eggs of each shape, hatched them out and reared the chicks separately. At the finish he had in both lots approximately half and half pullets and cockerels.  
A report of tests conducted at the Massachusetts Experiment Station confirms this result.

**York Market**

A good number of buyers and sellers were on hand Tuesday night at the North York Market, although some of the farmers experienced difficulty in negotiating the roads as the frost is going from them. "They were blasting the ice jams out my way yesterday," said one farmer, discussing the advent of spring with his neighbor. Maple sugar was to be seen at the market for the first time yesterday, and sold at 3 for 25c. Abundance of spring flowers, pussy willows and a very plentiful supply of eggs still further bespoke the advancing seasons.

Amongst the cut flowers were daffodils, poeticas, sweet peas, marigolds and pansies, bunches of big velvety blooms selling at 20c per bunch. Hyacinths were 25c and 30c per pot. Easter lilies 75c, ivy 25c and English wallflowers 70c per pot.

Eggs were fresh and plentiful, 45c. and 50. per dozen was asked for them and 70c per dozen for duck eggs. Butter was 40c. and 50c. per lb., cream 40c per pint; chicken, 40c per lb., roasting 35c for boilers. Delicious looking home-made sausage fetched 28c per lb. There were vegetables aplenty, carrots, parsnips, turnips and beets were 25c per 6 qt. basket; potatoes 30c or \$2 per bag. Cabbage was 5c and 10c. each. Lettuce, watercress, peppercress, spring onions and parsley, crisp and fresh, sold at 3 for 10c; tender little radishes were the same price.

Apples sold at 30c to 50c per 6 qt. basket, according to variety and quality. Greenings, Spies and Talman Sweets were most plentiful.

Among the home-made delicacies on sale was cottage cheese, 10c and 25c. per pint. Honey was 30c per pint, 35c for 2 1/2 lb., and 60c for 5 lbs.

**North York**

The resignation of Verna McDonald as public health nurse for the township of North York came as a surprise to members of the local board of health at its meeting in the municipal hall at Willowdale on Monday. Reeve Anderson stated that she was taking another position, more attractive. Miss McDonald will be released at the end of March and will receive a bonus of one month's salary.

There are now 56 cases of communicable disease in the township, according to the report of the medical officer of health, Dr. C. E. Hill. "There are eleven mild cases of measles in one school," Dr. Hill said, "and 42 cases of mumps in the township." He added that the water was in good condition.

Miss McDonald reported 978 pupils examined during the month. Four of these were excluded from school, while 16 had defects which were corrected. Eighty-five home visits were made, while there were eleven children present at the free clinic held last Friday. Call for Tender For New School Addition

Tenders for the new 4-room addition of the McKee Ave. Public School have been called for, and work will commence at an early date. The addition will cost approximately \$17,000, and will be fully equipped. The children will attend their usual classes while the addition is being erected.

**TOWNSHIP OF MARKHAM**

**LOADS OF VEHICLES ACT**

**Markham Township Notice**

Public notice is hereby given that said Act provides that during the months of March and April in each year, vehicles operating or objects being moved over or upon a public highway, which is not within a city or separated town, and having a carrying capacity exceeding one ton, shall not be loaded in excess of one-half the rated capacity of such vehicle or object without a permit as provided by said Act.

The Act also provides that notwithstanding such permit, the owner driver or operator of such vehicle or object is responsible for any damage caused to a highway by such vehicle or object. A penalty not exceeding \$100 is provided for a contravention of any of the provisions of said Act.

Notice is also hereby given that the provisions of the said Act will be strictly enforced with respect to the highways under the jurisdiction of the Township of Markham.

Road Commissioners are hereby instructed to watch their respective sections for overloaded vehicles, according to said Act, causing damages to the Township roads, and act accordingly.
