The above council held their fourth regular meeting at Sutton's Hotel on Saturday, the 28th day of April 1928. All the members present with Reeve, E. M. Legge in the chair, the minutes of the last meeting read and confirmed and the communications presented after which the treasurer was authorized to pay a number of bills and accounts.

Resolutions

MacMurchy-Jefferson— that William Dainty be paid the sum of \$30.00 for sheep killed and one worried by dogs as per sheep valuator's certificate now on file.

Jefferson-MacMurchy— That the supervisor be instructed to make arrangements re building a new culvert on Linton sideroad between 9 and 10 concessions.

Armstrong-MacMurchy— May it be resolved that Mr. Wm. Benfield be paid the sum of \$24.00, for keep of McGill children up to April 28th.

Armstrong-MacMurchy— That the treasurer pay to Ed. Nicol the sum of \$2.00, re dog tax for 1927, refund.

Armstrong-MacMurchy— That the Canadian Surety Company be paid the sum of \$40.00 re Bonds re Municipal Treasurer.

Jefferson-Egan—That the Clerk be authorized to instruct Mr. Farguhar to have the necessary repairs made to Schomberg lock-up.

MacMurchy-Jefferson— That the County Representatives of this Municipality introduce a resolution to be brought to the attention of the County Council at the June Session; Re making some arrangements re building some kind of a suitable cinder path for the safety of school children for Union School on Yonge Street.

Armstrong-Jefferson — That the clerk be instructed to send bill of P. M. Thompson, Re-Hibbart transportation to Hospital, be sent to clerk of Vaughan Township.

On motion Council adjourned to meet at Temperance Hall, Kettleby on Saturday, May 26th as a court of revision and other business.

York Market

About fifty farmers had produce to sell Tuesday night at the North Toronto market and a good buying crowd was on hand. There was a good demand for eggs and a plentiful supply. Asparagus at 20c per half pound, sold well, but there was not enough to meet the demand. No pork had been brought in, but headcheese was there at 10c per mold. Beading plants and perennials were plentiful and varied.

Prices were as follows:

Butter, 45c. Whipping cream, 35c. and 40c per pint. Eggs, 30c, 35c and 40c per doz., duck eggs, 60c. Rose bushes, 35c, 3 for \$1. Geraniums 20c and Irish moss 25c per pot. Pansy roots and tomato plants, 25c per box, Raspberries (Herberts), 50c per doz. canes. Hollyhock, delphinium, 20c per root. Salvia 6 for 25c, and baby breath roots, 25c per bunch. Cabbage plants 20c doz. Asparagus, 20c per 1/2 lb. bunch. Rhubarb (outside), 2 for 15c.; green onions, lettuce, watercress, peppercress and radishes, 3 for 10c. Potatoes, 25c per 6 quart \$1.90 per bag. Dried onions, 15c quart. Lemon tarts, gingerbread and date cookies, 25c per doz.; jelly rolls, 20c each; shortbread, 60c per lb. Cream candies, 15c box. Blueberries, 50c quart; cherries and greengages, 50c per quart; mustard pickles and onions, 25c quart; honey, 10c, 20c, 40c per jar, 75c for 5 lbs.

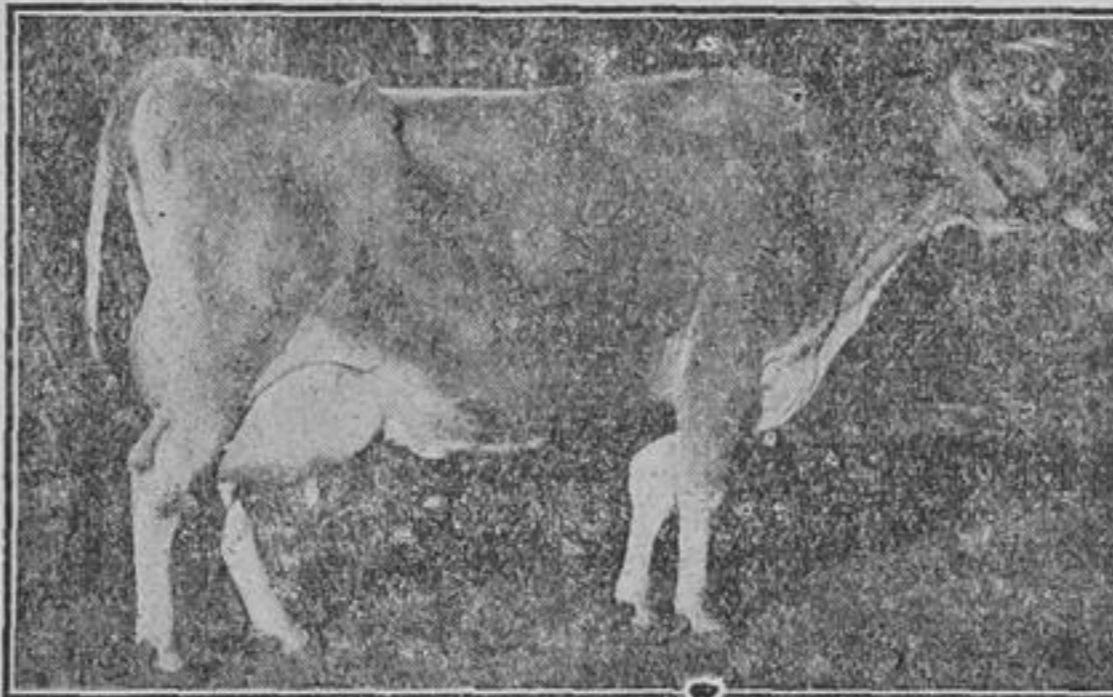

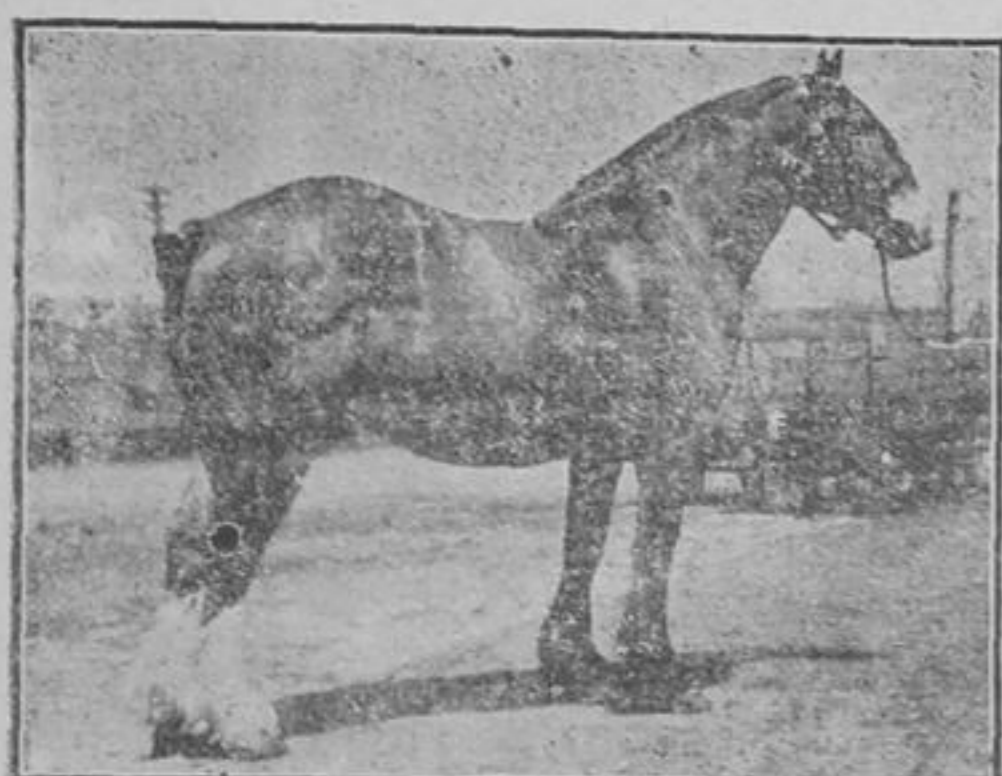

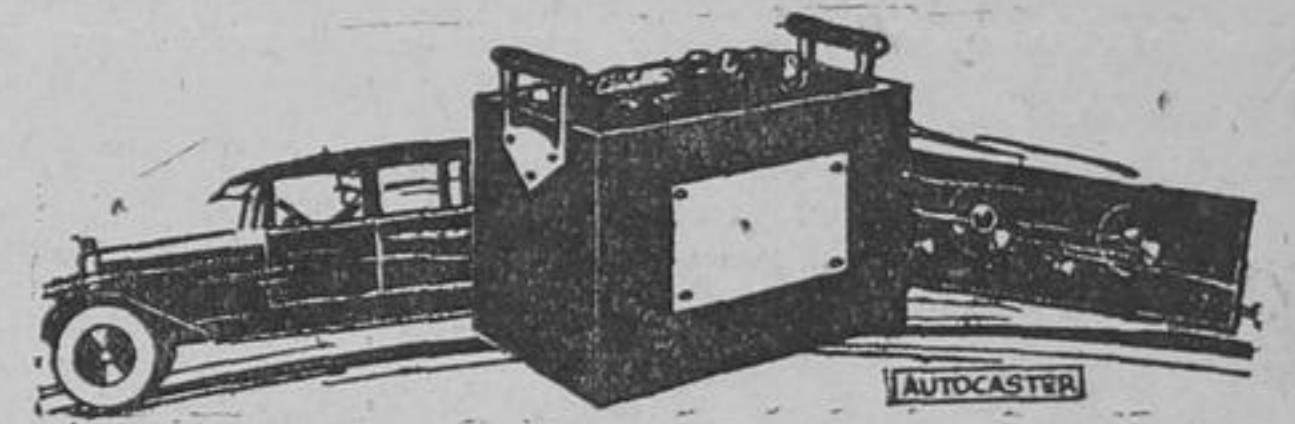
