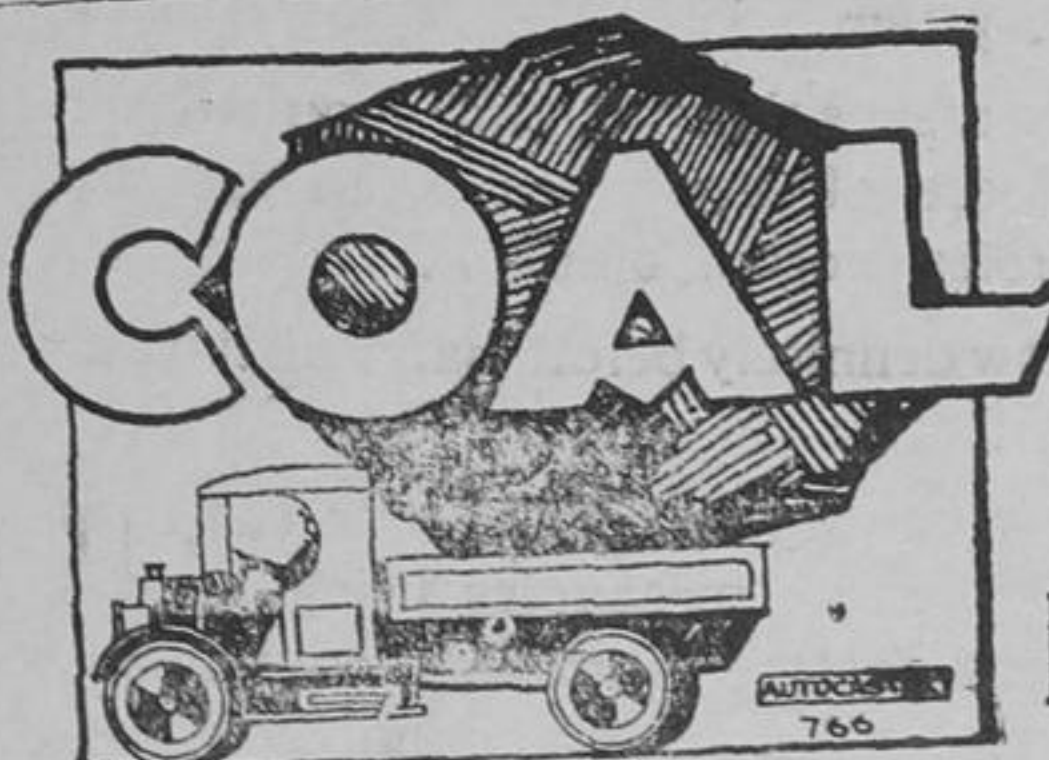

BLOOD PRESSURE

Blood pressure is the force that the heart exerts in order to pump the blood through the circulatory system. The heart is a hollow muscular organ which acts as a pump to keep the blood in circulation. The blood leaves the heart in two streams. One stream carries the blood to the lungs where it is purified; the other stream goes to all parts of the body, carrying food to the tissues.

The arteries are hollow tubes which carry the blood. Normal arteries are soft and elastic. The impulse of the heart beat is carried along through the arteries and can be felt at the wrist, where it is called the pulse.

In the normal, healthy body, the blood pressure is normal. Certain abnormal conditions, particularly those affecting the heart, arteries and kidneys, cause an alteration in the blood pressure and it becomes abnormal.

An abnormal blood pressure is not a disease but is a symptom of some abnormal condition. It is a warning sign and the physician seeks for and treats the cause.

Disregard of the needs of the body for exercise, rest, proper food and such things, throws a needless strain upon the whole system, and one symptom of this is frequently an increased blood pressure.

The family physician should be consulted regularly for advice as to how to live. The periodic health examination is not only for the purpose of discovering abnormal conditions, but also for receiving advice as to how to keep normal.

Fees were then received by the secretary and the meeting was dismissed. A dainty luncheon and social period under the direction of the hostess brought the meeting to a conclusion.

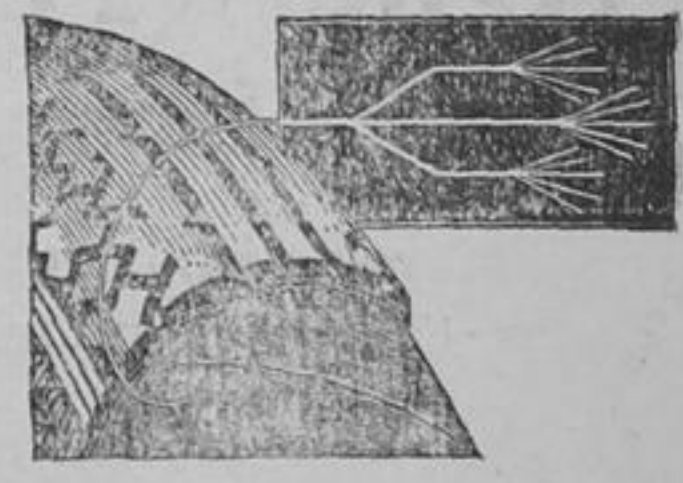
