A newspaperman wandering in Central Park within a couple of blocks of the social centre of New York City, was startled to see a sign, "Pigs For Sale." He investigated. In the park's menagerie several porkers are kept so New Yorkers will know what a hog looks like. Surplus pigs are sold as soon as weaned, most of them being bought as pets by park visitors. Not long ago a dweller in a fashionable apartment was ordered to get rid of his hog. He had bought the baby pig and kept it in his rooms. But it grew up and began making so much noise the other tenants protested. A new litter of pigs always attracts thousands of visitors to the park. Another popular animal in the park is a cow—just an ordinary milk cow, but it is a novelty to the children who crowd around it all day long.

The Guelph City Council passed a compulsory closing by-law, but according to a decision handed down the other day by Judge Spotton of Guelph that city's Wednesday half holiday closing bylaw is ultra vires, and, as a consequence, merchants who have opposed the measure but who have been compelled to close their places of business for the half-day each week, pending the Judge's decision, will not have to suspend business in the future. Judge Spotton, in giving his decision, quashed a conviction registered by Magistrate Watt recently, against G. B. Ryan & Co., one of Guelph's largest department stores. The year-round half-holiday closing had been in vogue there for a number of years.

Premier Ferguson and Mrs. Ferguson sailed from New York recently on the Mauretania for a two months visit to the British Isles and the continent. During Mr. Ferguson's absence the member for East York, the Hon. George S. Henry, minister of Public Work and Highways will discharge the duties of Prime Minister and Attorney-General. Mr. Ferguson will be acting minister of Education.

Baron Byng, former Governor-General of Canada, has been chosen president of the council of village centres for disabled ex-service men to succeed the late Field Marshal Earl Haig. Earl Jellicoe also succeeds the late Earl Haig as president of the Empire Legion.

The largest grain shipment ever to leave Vancouver for the Orient, 400,000 bushels, has been loaded. This shipment will be the largest out of Vancouver this season and the third largest to any country in the history of the port.

It has taken eight years to complete the Roll of Honour which is to be placed in Liverpool Cathedral. It contains the names of 40,000 Liverpool men who lost their lives in the Great War. The volume probably largest of its kind in the world, consists of over 400 pages of vellum. The frontispiece was autographed by King George and each page is illuminated in gold and color.

A race of hitherto unknown primitive people which existed in Northern Africa at least 25,000 years ago, has been discovered by Dr. F. Cooper Cole, well known geologist. The newly discovered race probably is the ancestor of the Italians and Spaniards and other South Europeans, according to Dr. Cole, and is reported to be the most important find in years in explaining man's dim ancestry.

Old Tyme Fiddlers To Have Competition

York Pioneers to Have Contest at Sharon on June 2nd.

The York Pioneers and Historical Society will make their annual pilgrimage to the Temple at Sharon (four miles above Newmarket) next Saturday, June 2nd, when a public meeting will be held at 2 p.m. Standard Time.

The main event on the Program will be a contest for Old Fiddlers, open to all aged 65 or over. Three prizes will be given if there are sufficient entries, and an experienced judge has consented to act. Entries may be made at any time with the Secretary, N. F. Caswell, 148 King St. west Toronto.

Special music will be provided by the Chalmers United Choir, of Mount Dennis and Woodbine Ave. United Choir winners in the contest held at Richmond Hill on May 12. There will also be solos by Alex. Morgan and Alberta Robinson, winners at Richmond Hill, and an oration by Marie Draper, of Mt. Albert, on "The Glory of York County."

The meeting will be open to the public.

WEED INSPECTORS TO HOLD CONFERENCE

A meeting of the Weed Inspectors representing the Municipalities of York County, will be held at the Dept of Agriculture, Newmarket at 1.15 p.m. Standard Time, Tuesday, June 5th.

The object of this meeting is to interpret the Act as it now reads, to the Inspectors. Mr. Lernox of the Dominion Seed Branch will be the official in charge. Since the Act has been changed this year all the new clauses will be explained and the more harmful weeds will be shown to the Inspectors.

Saturday, June 2nd, is the date of the Big Horse and Pure Bred Stock Show to be held in the Town Park, Aurora. This Show always puts up a good afternoon's entertainment. The Briar Farm Competition for \$50, plus a silver tea service is attracting entries and will be a big class. The Township Class of Best 5 horses is another \$20.00 feature. How about our Township?
