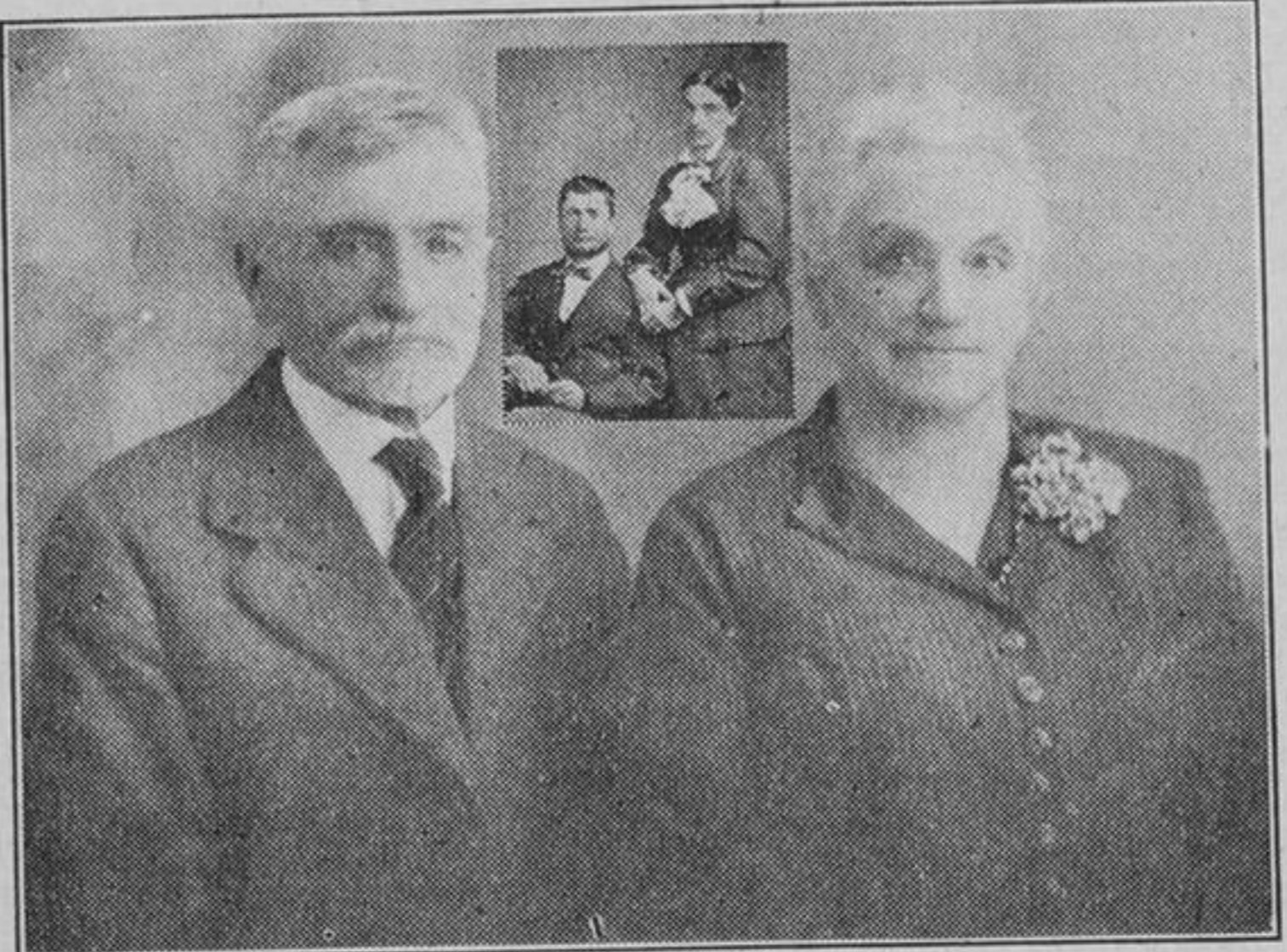

For about ten years after their marriage they farmed on the second concession of Markham and afterwards kept store and the post office at Headford for nearly thirty years.
