GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

Last Monday was nomination day in a good number of centres. Richmond Hill and the municipalities of York County still stick to the New Year for the elections and although it is probably the best idea of changing the date might be a good subject for consideration as the majority of municipalities where the new idea has been tried are well satisfied with the innovation.

The municipal pot is beginning to boil in North York Township and there promises to be three candidates for the Reeveship. Ex-Reeve Hicks, Deputy-Reeve Jas. Muirhead and F. J. Goode will seek the honors and Reeve W. W. Anderson has announced that he will retire.

There has been little definite in political rumors developed in local municipalities as yet however the passing of a few weeks will bring election day close at hand again.

At the regular session of County Council last week, Warden George B. Little was invested with the robes of office. Although an innovation in York County it is customary in many other counties and tends to aid dignity to the high office of warden.

Glaring headlights are illegal; but when has there been a conviction for their use? There are many dangerously dazzling lights seen on the highways at night and nothing seems to be done without them.

Wasaga Beach is to become the Canadian "Coney Island." A big American syndicate is reported to be formed for establishing a huge amusement park at the Beach. It will include 16 riding devices, sideshows, boxing arena, a covered rink for roller skating in summer and hockey in winter. This will be a great boom for the already popular summer resort.

Official estimates show that approximately eleven million people from the United States visited Ontario this year as motor tourists, spending varying periods of time in the province in their quest of pleasure and recreation. That is a tremendous invasion of the police, a huge body of people to be fed and sheltered for from one day to ninety or more days. It means that more people from the United States visited Ontario this year than the whole population of the Dominion of Canada, and it is estimated that while in the province they spend about \$100,000,000.

A man sentenced to fifty years for killing a policeman in Chicago has escaped from jail. The authorities are not likely to look for him, however. They probably made a mistake putting him there.

New dance popular at Paris was inspired by a snake. It's a kind of crawl—Toronto Telegram. Also sounds as if there might be some wiggles in it.

A Mitchell resident sowed 10 cents worth of turnip seed, which produced four large wagon loads of turnips. Some of the turnips were very large, one weighing 22½ pounds.

"Petticoat rule," about which we used to hear much is now more appropriately referred to as "Invisible government."

Appropriations totalling \$2,000,000 for level-crossing improvements will be made by the Federal Government during the next ten years, was announced recently.

The United States imported \$2,900,000 worth of iodine from Chile in 1927.

Port Elgin council has made a grant of \$100 towards advertising the town.

Broadway, Orangeville's "main street," has just been paved with asphalt 69 feet in width from curb to curb for a distance of five blocks in the business section. The sewage system and disposal plant will be completed and in operation in three weeks. The civic program undertaken by this year's council calls for an expenditure of about \$300,000, and will not be finished until next fall, when nearly every street in town will have a sewer and paved street.

A good suggestion designed to curb chicken stealing in the vicinity of Toronto comes from Ontario County which would have a law passed making it unlawful to transport chickens on the roads after dark. Ontario County, like York, is close to Toronto, and has suffered much from chicken thieves.

The annual turnip contest conducted by Stiver Bros. of Stouffville, is creating the usual interest among the farmers. Levi Burkholder holds the record for the largest turnip brought in thus far, it being 24 pounds. Edw. Logan produced three which made a bushel, but it is the individual turnip which counts in this contest. The farmer who brings in the largest turnip from seed sold by Stiver Bros. will receive a half barrel of flour free.

A head of a cabbage nearly five feet in circumference was exhibited by the Royal Agricultural Society in London.

It has been estimated that it costs nearly \$600,000,000 a year for the "upkeep" of the hair and complexion of American women.

Medicine sold in Chinese drug stores is wrapped in its prescription paper which often is quaintly phrased, as "Has a pleasant taste without poison."

The work of polishing 20,000,000 books in the British Museum with a preservative has begun and will probably take 50 years to complete.

In three years Raymond Briez of Paris has given 117 pints of blood in 264 transfusions, thought to be a world's record.

Chinese manufacturers use jasmine and other fragrant flowers in making scented tea.

A company has been formed in Danville, Ill., for the manufacture of paper from cornstalks.

York County breeders and grain growers were prominent among the winners at the Royal Winter Fair. J. H. Frisby and Thos. Frisby, of Markham township were winners in the seed and grain classes, Chas. Boynton of Dollar won prizes and championships with Yorkshires and Tamsworths, S. Rattle, Milliken, won prominence in the sheep classes, James Baggs and son, Edgerley were prominent winners in the Jersey classes and G. A. M. Davison was an outstanding exhibitor of ponies and high steppers.
