Mr. and Mrs. G. W. Keffer and family, spent Sunday in Toronto the guests of Mr. and Mrs. Patter.

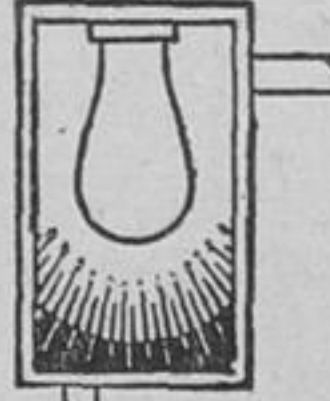
