GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

Ontario elections on Wednesday, October 30th.

It will be a short campaign.

Despite declarations to the contrary the liquor question will be a major issue in many ridings.

Hon. George S. Henry will be a candidate for re-election in East York and it might be a good time to ask him what his policy is regarding transportation on Yonge Street.

If the Minister is in favor of giving the T.T.C. a bus monopoly on Yonge Street and on the roads throughout the province the people should ask a few questions on the subject.

The policy of the Government in neglecting to provide footpaths and sidewalks on Yonge Street for pedestrians should also be explained during the campaign by the late member for East York.

Richmond Hill votes in East York, Markham township also votes in East York, but Vaughan is in South York where Leo. P. Macauley was the representative in the last house.

P. W. Pearson represented North York and it is freely intimated in well informed circles that Col. T. H. Lennox, M. P. will resign his seat in the federal house to contest this seat.

The work of several county constables in the Holland Landing marsh country during the last week was successful in revealing a whiskey distilling outfit, and a large quantity of mash ready to run off a batch of illicit moonshine. Over 200 gallons of the mixture was found and destroyed, also a still with a capacity of 25 gallons. The raid and investigations were carried out under the lead of Sgt. Tom Kirk, of Newmarket, who states that arrest may follow.

A large list of entries, including many of the best hunters in Canada, entered the North York hunter field trials, at Hazelburn Farm, near Aurora, on Saturday.

Bopeep, the 5 year old pacing mare, owned by Herb Reid, proprietor of Woodbridge Inn, won second money in the 2.30 class on the Oshawa track at the South Ontario Fair.

When two cars crashed head-on on Yonge Street near Willowdale about 6 o'clock last Thursday night, Mrs. John Malloy, 1221 Shaw street, was seriously injured and two other passengers were badly shaken up.

The crash occurred when a car driven by J. Candler, of London, pulled over to the left side of the road to avoid striking a car which had suddenly stopped in front of him. The Malloy car, which was coming the opposite way, crashed into him and both machines were hurled into the ditch. Police did not hold either driver.

The very dry weather has made plowing very difficult, however considerable fall wheat has been sown and some fields are reported up.

Newmarket reverted to standard time last Sunday morning.

Bolton citizens are boosting for the organization of a town band.

There are a large number of rural mail routes in the district adjacent to Rich'd Hill. A very great proportion of the population outside the towns and villages have their mail delivered every day by regularly-appointed carriers. For the reception of mail matter, boxes are conveniently placed. When the boxes are obtained, the names of the subscribers are plainly painted thereon. This serves as a guide to persons driving through the country. But gradually the lettering fades, and becomes indistinct. The periodic renewal would not be an expensive matter and would be a great convenience to strangers in our midst as well as to residents of the county. Make the names on the boxes plain.

GEORGE A. McLEAN
George A. McLean, who was nominated as Liberal candidate in the Federal riding of East Simcoe. He was educated in Mara Township Public School, Orillia Collegiate and the University of Toronto, where he was Vice-President of the "Lit" in 1914. He enlisted with the Nineteenth Battalion as a private, and later was with the Northumberland Fusiliers (Imperial) until the end of the war, attaining the rank of Captain. He was seriously wounded in 1917. Mr. McLean was a member of the Orillia town Council for five years, being Mayor for two years, 1924-25.
