**Fine Exhibits Feature Annual Markham Township School Fair**

The annual School Fair for Markham township was held at the Crosby Memorial rink, Unionville on Tuesday and attracted a large crowd of people from all parts of the municipality and was featured by excellent exhibits and by keenly contested competitions. The weather was fine although a few showers came along late in the afternoon they did not materially interfere with the carrying out of the program. The exhibits of fruit and vegetables in the rink was worthy of the township and the many visitors freely commented on their splendid quality. One old resident in viewing the varied exhibits remarked to The Liberal "I never thought there was such corn in Markham this year."

The drill competitions attracted much interest as did the competitive speech making and recitations. All are very commendable features of the fair and the events evidenced efficient preparatory training by the teachers in the different sections. Many of the boys brought their live stock and it would not be surprising if some of these same boys who are getting the proper training in their school days will some day be leading stockmen at the large fairs of the Dominion.

The handsome Eaton trophy for the pupil winning the most points at the fair was won by Miss Gwen Smith of Headford. Miss Innes Williamson of S.S. No. 15 was second and Miss Florence Morden of S.S. No. 16 third.

In the competition winning the most awards S.S. No. 11 was first and S.S. No. 3 was second. This prize is awarded after taking the attendance of the school into consideration.

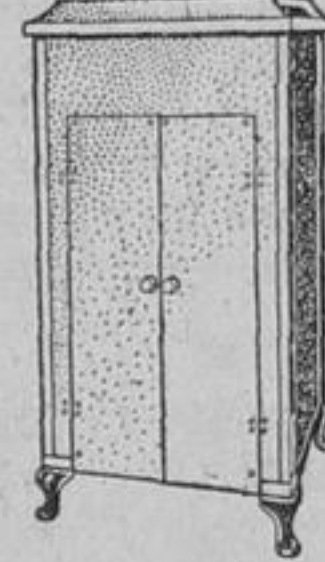

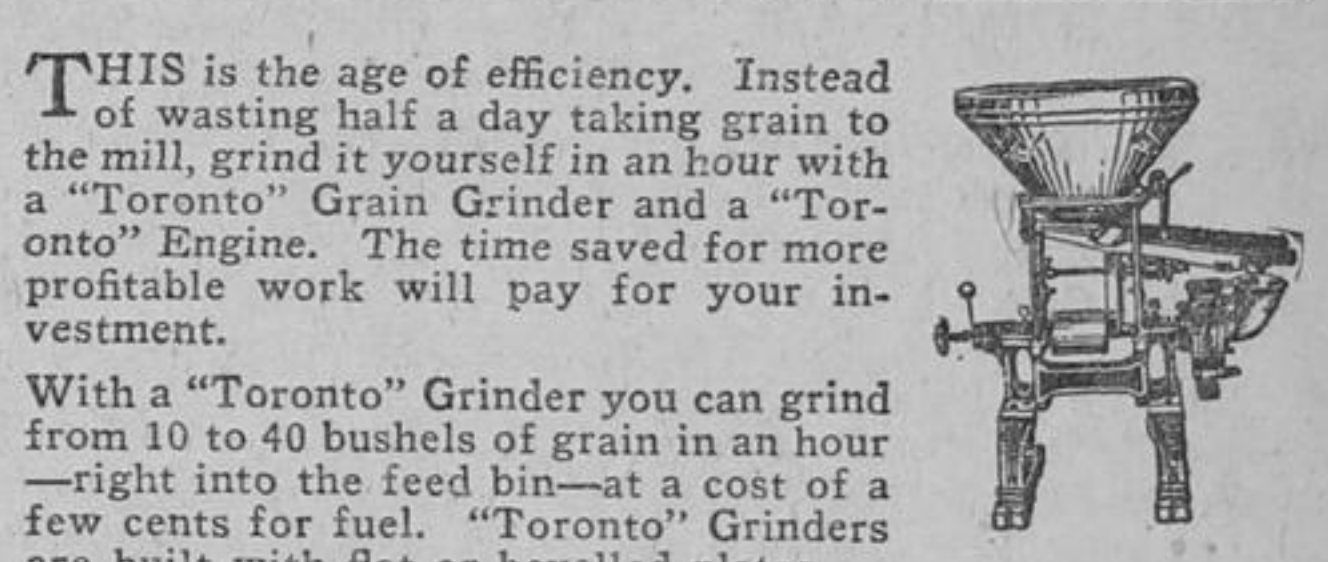

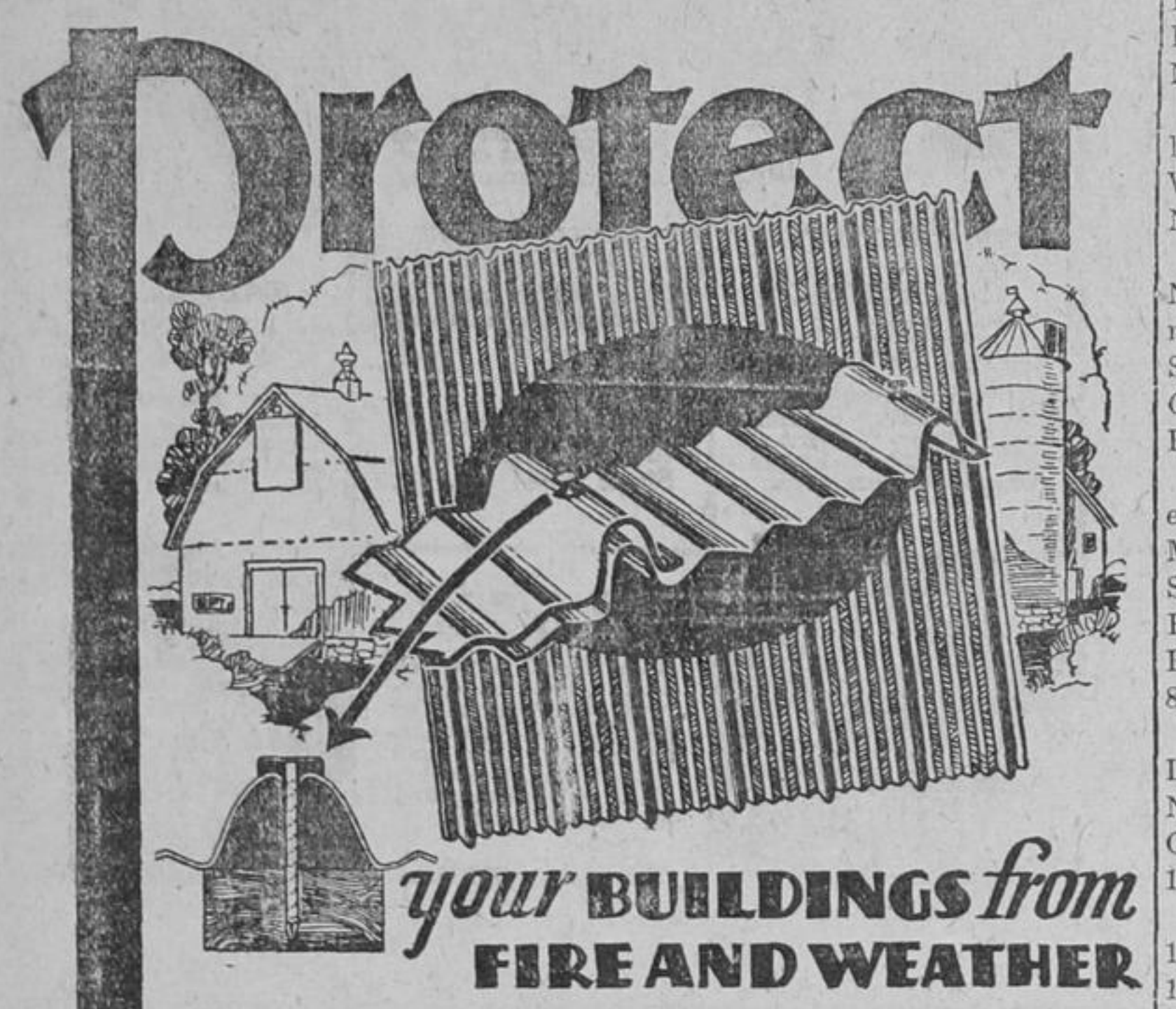
