GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

Spring will soon be here. We can feel it in the air these fine days.

To Mrs. Norman Wilson, of Ottawa, has gone the honor of being appointed the first woman member of the Canadian Senate.

York County Council on Saturday, concluded a thirteen day session which constitutes a record.

The council also established a record by passing 84 resolutions. At that it was only a little more than one for every member.

It is only natural that as the council grows in numbers the resolutions will show a corresponding increase.

Another item which will increase is the cost to the ratepayers.

Anniversary services were observed at Lansing-Willowdale Presbyterian churches last Sunday.

Deputy-Reeve R.L. Stiver, of Markham township was appointed by the County Council as a member of the Children's Aid Commission taking the place of Magistrate William Keith.

Reeve James Robson, of Vaughan has been appointed as a member of the Old Age Pension Board for the County. Other members are Reeve Leslie East York, Reeve Dean, York Township, Reeve Kidd, Whitchurch, Reeve Wallace, of Swansea. Ex-deputy reeve H. E. Beckett, of Scarborough, will be retained as secretary.

At the conclusion of the County Council session, treasurer, D. J. McDonald, Clerk Phillips and Miss G. Whitmore, stenographer, were suitably remembered by the councillors as a mark of appreciation of their services.

The Dominion Parliament was officially opened to-day with all the traditional pomp and ceremony.

According to the latest issue of Municipal Statistics for the province of Ontario the average daily consumption of water per head in Richmond Hill for 1929 was 34 gallons. The lowest daily per head consumption in the province was in Acton, where the figure is 11 gallons, and the highest was Sarnia with an average per head daily consumption of 244 gallons.

The annual report shows that the Richmond Hill waterworks was constructed in 1921. It serves a population of 1170 and the total number of gallons consumed in a year was 14,700,000. The earnings in 1928 were \$6,693, and the operating expenses and capital charges were \$13,499.46 showing a loss of \$6,805.75.

The assets of the Richmond Hill waterworks are shown as \$114,251.82 and the liabilities as \$103,866.60.

There are 158 municipally owned water systems in Ontario and of that number 59 show a loss and 99 show a profit.

York County Council has held the longest session in its history. Is this due to increasing work or more leisurely methods? asks the Toronto Globe.

work over limited roads available for them to run a truck or car. The latest victim is Harvey Clendenning of the Markham-Whitchurch townline, whose pens were visited Tuesday last week and 60 fine birds taken.

Barrie Agricultural Society had a successful year, having a balance of \$992.76 on hand after the expenses of the fair were paid, together with \$370.72 of accounts and prizes over hanging from 1928. \$1,762 was paid in prizes.

At the last meeting of the Milton Council it was decided unanimoously to discontinue at once the ringing of the curfew bell, which has been heard in that town every night at 9 o'clock for many years. The only persons who paid any attention to the bell were the old fellows who played checkers in the grocery stores.

An example of the changing problems in York County is evidenced by the following from the files of fifty years ago.

"At York County Council Mr. Williamson pointed out that, now that there was a determination to improve the York roads, it would be well to supplement the movement by offering reduced toll rates for wagons with broad tires. Mr. Fleury, however, advised caution in reducing the tolls, saying: "If a man drove his four-inch tire wheels over Yonge Street and got one of them into one of the ruts made by the ordinary wheel, he would probably stick fast. It would take 10-inch wheels to avoid this."

Even though road conditions were unfavorable, Community Hall, Kleinburg, was packed to the doors last Friday night when Kleinburg and Nashville Women's Institute staged its annual oyster supper and entertainment.


