Inter-County Visiting

Farmers' excursions from Welland, Wellington, Kent, Lambton and Essex are visiting Norfolk County this summer. As a writer in the Farmers' Sun remarks: "If the time and gasoline can be spared and the trip is wellplanned, this inter-county visiting seems to be a promising development. There are few of us who cannot learn something by observing what farmers in other parts of the province are doing and how they do it. Norfolk can show most counties something in growing and selling apples; Oxford can give most some pointers in dairy farming; West Middlesex knows how to grow potatoes and other sections have their strong as well as weak points.

Plow in July

"Plow in July while it's dry" is the slogan adopted by farmers of Wellington County in their combat to eliminate the "Million Dollar Menace"the sow thistle. The method described by Ralph Clemens, agricultural representative, is perhaps the best adapted to the poorly drained heavy clay soils on which sow thistle best thrives. A modern two-furrow plow is used, drawn by four horses or a tractor. The hay is gotten off early and the land is plowed while dry to a depin of six or eight inches. The clods thus turned up, if left for a few days will dry out so that the sun and air will kill perhaps 70 per cent of the sow thistle roots. After a week, if rain has not intervened, a heavy broad toothed cultivator or heavy disc is used to expose all the roots to the killing effects of heat and drouth.




