GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

A-B-C—Always be careful

The Canadian National Exhibition takes the centre of the stage.

Newmarket won the Mackenzie King cup emblematic of the Baseball championship of Ontario and York Counties. Aurora players were runners-up. Newmarket enters the O.B.A.A. play-offs.

The Newmarket Firemen's Garden Party realized over \$1,000 in proceeds.

At the last regular meeting Whit-church council paid a sheep claim of \$210 to P. Murphy for eight killed and four injured by dogs.

Deputy-Reeve T. M. Baker of Vaughan Township on Wednesday evening August 13th, completed his 1930 harvesting and threshing. The grand finale was accomplished exactly 18 days after the binder cut the first grain. Mr. Baker reports a very good crop and has over 3,000 bushels of fine grain in his granary. We believe this constitutes a harvesting and threshing record which will be hard to beat in this section of Ontario.

Municipalities of Newmarket and Aurora are still discussing the purchase of the radials north of Richmond Hill. Newmarket 50 per cent., Aurora, 37 per cent., King, 4 per cent., Whitechurch, 4 per cent., Markham 2 1-2 per cent, Vaughan, 2 1-2 per cent.
