## GENERAL NEWS AND VIEWS

Decoration Day services at the Richmond Hill Cemetery next Sunday afternoon. All return men are asked to meet and parade to the cemetery.

The Exhibition is over—begin to think of the winter's coal yet?

A tributary to the Humber River which connects with the parent stream in the flat lands of James Huson's farm, a mile and a quarter south of Woodbridge, on the 8th concession, is the home of a large family of snapping turtles. Residents of the vicinity recently found it necessary to have one of the family disposed of. This specimen is of monstrous size weighing close to 100 pounds. It was shot by Fred Wright.

Responsibility, not only for attempting to force a continuance of low milk prices on producers in the farming area surrounding Toronto, but for failure to pass on to Toronto consumers a reduction in milk prices accepted by the producers last June, was placed squarely on the shoulders of Toronto milk distributors at a meeting of the Toronto Milk Producers' Association in Markham last week.

Old age pensions being paid in Ontario now total \$7,200,000 per annum, while grants under the Mothers' Allowance Act total \$2,250,000 per annum, according to Hon. Dr. David Jamieson, Toronto, Chairman of the Ontario Provincial Government Commission on Mothers' Allowance and Old Age Pensions. Although it has been in effect only a short time there are about 32,000 pensioners under the Act in Ontario.

Port Credit has passed a by-law prohibiting the discharging of firearms within the village. Firecrackers cannot be used within 100 feet of the highway.

Part of Guelph's street railway is being torn up. The rails have already been removed from Edinburgh Road as far as Sultan street. The street railway employees are at present busy taking up the tracks on Suffolk street. Buses will be put on instead of the coaches.

Prospects of Aurora entering a team in the junior O.H.A. were strengthened when council awarded William Green, local builder, the contract for the erection of the new hockey and agricultural arena at a cost of \$14,600. Nine tenders were received. The ice surface will be 175 by 75 feet with space reserved for the installation of an artificial ice machine. Seating capacity will be 1,200. According to the stipulation of council, local labor will be given preference, and material from the old rink will be incorporated in the new one as far as possible. The rink will be of steel construction. Work will be started at once "subject to the provision that the town gets a clear deed to the property."

Water, running at the rate of 25,000 gallons per day was struck one day last week by drillers at work on the new artesian well in Newmarket. That's faster than it ran from the broken main in Markham Township.

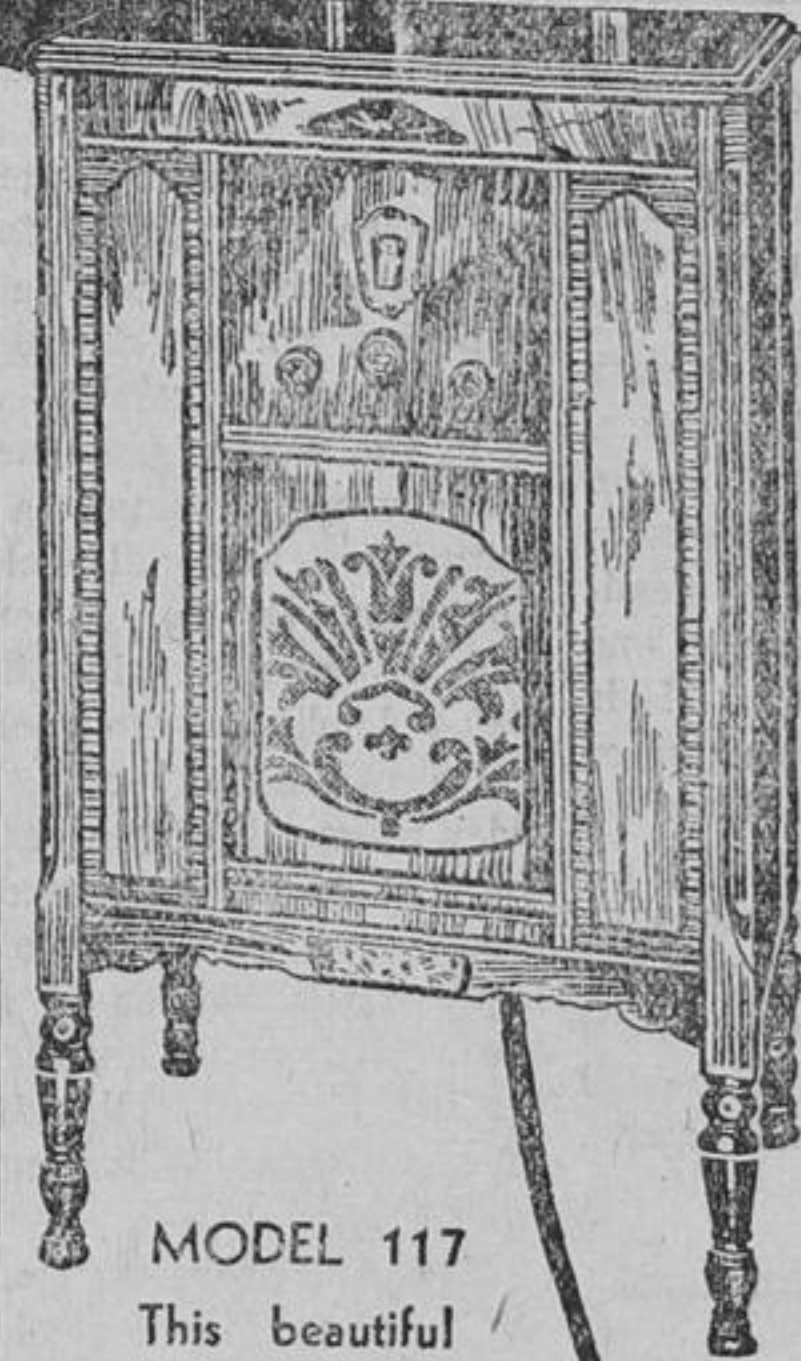
