### Municipality of the Village of Richmond Hill

By-Law No. 430

To regulate the location of Gasoline Pumps in the Village of Richmond Hill.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill enacts as follows:

That on and after the date of the coming into force of this by-law, no gasoline pump shall be located within a less distance than eight feet inside the street line.

That gasoline tanks must be located wholly within the limits of the applicant's private property, not less than eight feet inside the street line.

That a permit must be obtained, authorized by the Village Council, before either gasoline tanks or pumps are installed.

That this by-law shall come into operation and be of

full force and effect on the 3rd day of April 1933. Read a first, second and third time and passed, April
